Why Have One?

- Unused or expired prescription medications are a public safety issue, leading to accidental poisoning, overdose and abuse.
- Pharmaceutical drugs can be just as dangerous as street drugs when taken without a doctor's supervision.
- The non-medical use of prescription drugs ranks 2nd only to marijuana as the most common form of drug abuse in America

- The majority of teenagers abusing prescription drugs get them from family and friends - and the home medicine cabinet
- Unused drugs that are flushed contaminate the water supply.
- Unused prescription drugs thrown in the trash can be retrieved and abused or illegally sold.
- Proper disposal of unused drugs saves lives and protects the environment.
