SMALL TWISTER WAS SPOTTED

Thunderstorms around the Indianola area yesterday produced a tornado that touched the ground south of town. The smaller twister was spotted by the weather spotters and the public. Most of the severe weather stayed in northwest Kansas last night. Tornado warnings were issued for the Goodland, Scott City and Colby areas. A tornado warning was also issued for parts of Frontier County after a funnel cloud was spotted near Stockville. Reports of .25-.35 rainfall were reported around the McCook area.

FAVORITE TEACHER

Ask many students who their favorite teacher on the McCook Community College campus is and their answer -- if they are majoring in business -- would be Lorrie Mowry. At spring commencement ceremonies Friday Mowry received the 2016 Dr. Gene Budig Outstanding Faculty award. "She is an awesome educator with current, relevant real-life examples to share with her students in whatever class she is teaching," said one letter nominating her for the Budig award. With her background in organizational leadership and communication she works with all types of students. With the online courses she taught this semester there were nearly 100 online students. Mowry serves as the co-adviser of the McCook chapter of Phi Beta Lambda and has participated in trash pick-up bloodmobiles, delivering valentine's orders and is known as the "baking queen" for the cinnamon rolls she contributed to PBL bake sales. In past years she has organized joint meetings of area FBLA members and of the PBL chapter during Inter-high day activities. She has taken PBL members to their national leadership conference for the past five years to Nashville, Anaheim, Orlando, and Atlanta. One nomination letter cited Mowry's encouragement to these students to achieve top 15 placings in the national PBL competition. She helps to make arrangements for fund raisers and had the ingenious idea of producing the MCC blankets which have become a real big hit with students and the community. She assists with all chapter responsibilities especially when it comes to making travel arrangements for many of the national leadership conferences.

TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE

When people from Russia and Australia want to head to Nebraska, you know something big is going to happen. A coast-to-coast total solar eclipse will occur inside a 65- to 70-mile-wide swath that will make its way across the country on Aug. 21, 2017. It will start in northwest Oregon before passing through the nation's midsection and wrapping up in South Carolina. In between, parts of 12 other states will be prime viewing areas in what's called "the path of totality." That includes about 3 square miles of southwest Iowa and a diagonal strip of Nebraska, from the northwest part of the Panhandle to the extreme southeast corner. It will be the first total solar eclipse seen in the United States since 1979. The next one will be in 2024.

The McCook High School Bison golfers were crowned GNAC Conference champs Friday at Heritage Hills. The Bison finished with a team score of 315, six strokes better than Kearney. Norfolk and North Platte finished third and fourth. Bison senior Noah Hofman was the medalist, shooting a season low round of 68. Bison senior Riley Loop also medaled, finishing with a round of 78. The Bison will compete in the Ogallala Invite on Thursday. MHS will host the district meet next Monday at Heritage Hills.

The MHS Lady Bison Tennis team finished fourth at the GNAC meet on Saturday in Lexington. Kearney won the meet with 34 points, two better than Lexington. MHS scored 22 points. MHS freshman Cassidy Michaelis led the Bison, winning all seven matches at number two singles and first place. The number two doubles team of Corinne Bortner/Katie Kjendal won five of seven matches and third place. The Bison varsity will host their own invite on Friday. The Bison JV's are in Kearney for an invite today.
