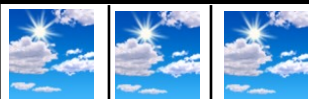

FIRST ACCREDITATION SURVEY

The Community Hospital sleep studies lab underwent its first specialty accreditation survey by the Accreditation Commission for Health Care. Hospital leaders learned this week it is fully accredited. The lab had been previously accredited as a part of the hospital accreditation until recent changes with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services rules. To comply with CMS, Community Hospital is now required to be accredited under a separate accreditation by one of two approved CMS agencies. TALK OF WITHDRAWING FROM NAFTA

Talk by President Trump about withdrawing from NAFTA sent shock waves through agriculture; shock waves felt in Nebraska. Mexico is the number one buyer of Nebraska corn. "You're talking about, again, billions of dollars worth of trade that is at risk if you disrupt this relationship with Mexico," Gov. Pete Ricketts told reporters during a recent news conference. "When you're looking at the state of Nebraska, nearly 34,000 jobs being dependent on upon that that impacts actual families here in our state." Trade with Mexico is estimated to have a \$287 million impact on the state economy. Mexico is the largest market for U.S. corn, buying approximately 20% of the corn and corn co-products produced in this country. Last year, Mexico bought 523.5 million bushels of corn from the United States, valued at \$2.5 billion. The U.S. also exported 1.9 million metric tons of distiller's dried grains with soluble, a byproduct of ethanol.

The McCook Lady Bison Tennis team captured their first-ever Class B state title Friday in Lincoln. The MHS girls edged Omaha Duchesne in the team standings 42-41.5. One year after falling short in the championship match, MHS sophomore Kassidy Michaelis won the Class B number two singles division with a straight-set win over Brylee Lauby of Lexington. The number one doubles team of Lauren Koetter/Kacee Samway lost their first match of the spring in the title match vs top-seed Omaha Skutt. The number two doubles team of Katie Kjendal/Syd Thompson also finished as runners-up, falling to York in the championship match. Bison junior Cassiddy Beebe finished 2-2 at number one singles.

The Chase County girls won the Class C state track and field title for the second straight year Saturday in Omaha. The Longhorns scored 65.5 points, 25 more than runner-ups Crofton and Ainsworth. Ogallala won the Class B boys division with 68 points. MHS finished sixth with 31 points, but were just five points out of second place. Sam Smith brought home silver medals in the 200 and 400 meters. Zach Schlager was third in the 110 high hurdles, Morgan Fawver third in the triple jump and DJ Gross was sixth in the discus. Aurora won the Class B girls division with 57 points, eight more than Holdrege. The Lady Bison scored five points. The Bison 400 meter relay was seventh while junior Emily Jacobs finished sixth in the 800 meters.
