

FUNERAL FOR TOM KIPLINGER

Funeral services are set for tomorrow for long-time Red Willow County Fairgrounds supporter Tom Kiplinger. Kiplinger passed away on Saturday at Community Hospital at the age of 88. Visitation will be today, at Herrmann Jones Funeral Chapel in McCook, NE, from 10:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. Funeral services for Tom will be Wednesday, August 2, 2017, 10:30 a.m. at the Kiplinger Arena, Red Willow Fairgrounds, McCook, Nebraska with military honors. Johnny Walker will be officiating. Private burial will be at a later time. Memorials may be given in his name to the Justin Cowboy Crisis Fund, Executive Director, 101 Rodeo Drive, Colorado Springs, CO 80919. PLANS FOR GREAT AMERICAN ECLIPSE

Governor Pete Ricketts and state agencies outlined their plans ahead of the Great American Eclipse on August 21, 2017. A total solar eclipse, a rare event, will be visible across Nebraska and is predicted to bring as many as half a million visitors to the state to see the rare occurrence. For a short period of time, the moon will block out the sun's light, across approximately 468.4 miles of Nebraska, from the border with Wyoming to Falls City. Large crowds, long lines, and heavy traffic are expected at eclipse events in the path of totality across the state. "We are excited to welcome visitors from around the globe to beautiful Nebraska to witness this rare phenomenon as it crosses our areat state," said Governor Ricketts. "The wide open spaces of Nebraska offer great viewing locations. We invite visitors to come to Nebraska and make a weekend of the event by visiting communities across the state which are hosting great events. Ahead of this weekend, we are also encouraging Nebraskans to prepare for heavy travel across the state, and to make their eclipse viewing or regular work plans accordingly."

UPHILL BATTLE

It seems like it has been an uphill battle for TransCanada to get the Keystone XL pipeline built through Nebraska. TransCanada's Vice President of External Communications Terry Cunha says they are not giving up on the project. Cunha says, "I can assure you we are committed to this project. We have been working very diligently through this Public Service Commission process for the past year. Just last week we were at our fourth public meeting and we are getting ready for our public hearing in Lincoln and I believe that would demonstrate to Nebraskans our commitment on moving this project forward." There have been some reports that as a business proposition, this project is less attractive that I was nine years ago when it started. Cunha disagrees saying they went back to the marketplace earlier this month to show their contracts with new customers and still have good support from their existing customer base. He says they are now finalizing those contracts. Last week there were questions whether there was enough demand to continue with the project. Cunha says officials were trying to answer a question related to the fact right now the project doesn't have the Nebraska Public Service Commission's approval.



The McCook National Bank Seniors saw their season come to an end last night, falling to Gering 8-0 in a Class B State Seniors elimination game. MNB finishes their season with a record of 29-10. Nebraska City eliminated Alliance 14-2. Omaha Roncalli stayed unbeaten with a 10-0 win over Wahoo. Today, Nebraska City will face Wahoo at 4 pm MT. Omaha Roncalli/Gering will follow.

Five members of the Chadron State College football team, including Head Football Coach Jay Long, attended the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Kickoff Monday morning at the Marriott Hotel in Colorado Springs. As announced at the media day event, the Eagles were picked to finish eighth in the conference standings in 2017. Also announced were the Preseason All-RMAC picks, voted on by the coaches, of which senior Collin Eisenman was the lone member for CSC. Eisenman, a combo-outside linebacker/end from Sheridan, Wyoming, returns after finishing ninth in the league for both pass sacks (five) and tackles for loss (10.0). He led the team for the second consecutive season in both categories, finishing 2016 as an All-RMAC Second Team selection. The football team will be begin working to shed their preseason ranking and climb back toward the top of the conference standings when the players report Sunday, Aug. 6 for photo day, to check out equipment and take care of paperwork. The first of the 23 practices allowed by the NCAA before the season kicks off will begin the following day. The Eagles will open the season on Saturday, Sept. 2 against the Fort Lewis Skyhawks in Durango, Colorado. Their first home game will be the following Saturday against Colorado Mines.
