## 2-DAY WELLNESS FAIR

The health fair will highlight Community Hospital's services, offer continental breakfast, and a variety of health screenings at a free or reduced rate.lood Tests Provided by McCook Clinic, PC: Comprehensive Metabolic Profile plus Lipid Profile—\$35. Fasting is required for this test (no food or drink other than water) 12 hours prior. This test gives 22 results including cholesterol (LDL and HDL), electrolytes, blood sugar, liver health, kidney function and triglycerides (blood fats) and more. Thyroid-Stimulating Hormone—\$25. Screens for thyroid gland problems. Prostate Specific Antigen for men—\$20. Screens for prostate cancer. CBC or Complete Blood Count—\$10. Measures the number of red and white blood cells and the total amount of hemoglobin in the blood. HGBA1C—\$20. Also known as A1C, this test is a marker for average blood glucose levels over the previous three months. ## "WEAR RED DAY"

Nebraskans are encouraged to clothe themselves in something red today as a way to draw attention to a critical health issue. Lauren Livingston, spokeswoman for the American Heart Association, says Wear Red Day events aim to raise awareness about heart disease, the leading cause of death in Nebraska. "Lots of businesses are doing activities," Livingston says. "They might have heart health tables set up at their offices or they might be going on company walks, anything to promote heart health. They're sharing pictures on social media of themselves wearing red. Across the nation, there are lots of Go Red for Women luncheons." Every year, some 4,600 Nebraskans die from heart disease, about a third of all deaths statewide. While the numbers are grim, she says there is cause for optimism. "It's affecting one in three people in America which is a huge number but, the good news is that 80% of heart disease and stroke is preventable through healthy lifestyle changes," Livingston says.

## NEBRASKA ABOVE GROWTH NEUTRAL POINT

The Mid America Business Conditions Index for the nine state area that includes Nebraska remained above that growth neutral point for the 14th straight month in January. Creighton University Economist Ernie Goss says the January index slipped slightly but still remains in that positive growth territory. Goss says, "The economy is looking good. The number dipped from 59, which is very solid, very healthy, down to 57.3 for January. Again, that is in a range I call healthy. Fourteen straight months it has been above growth neutral so we are seeing for the region good growth for the next three to six months." The durable, nondurable and nonmanufacturing sectors are adding jobs at a solid pace.

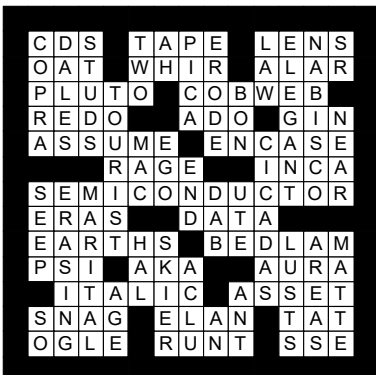
## SPORTS

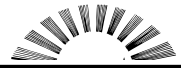
