The breakfast focuses on bringing local, regional and national leaders to McCook to relate their community service stories in the spirit of Sen. NEWEST OWNERS WELCOMED

This May, McCook Economic Development Corporation welcomed the newest owners to the Industrial Park when Luis and Maria Lopez purchased #1 Industrial Park Drive. The Lopez family has moved to McCook from Denver with their four children, Felipe, 19, Anthony, 16, Maria Giselle, 12, and Isabel, 10. They are planning to have their auto mechanic and diesel shop open in the spring of 2019. Luis and Maria became familiar with McCook thanks to a good friend, Omar Carbajal. During their visits to McCook, the idea of moving to a smaller community grew for the Lopez's. Luis has owned his own repair shop in Denver since 2013. They sold their shop in Denver and have used the proceeds from the sale to move, buy and fix up a home, and now start to build their shop in McCook. They are doing most of the work themselves to get up and running and are excited for the opportunity to become a part of the community. The Lopez family purchased the fourth business lot sold. Silverstone was the first occupant who came in 2002. Eleven years later, in 2013, Booe Machinery and Salvage became the second owner. Then, last year Next Generation made a major investment into the industrial park to expand their network of liquid storage for the agriculture industry. There are still four lots for sale at the industrial park.

RELEASE OF A PROPOSAL

The Nebraskans United coalition is preparing to release a proposal that promises to adequately fund K-12 education while also providing property tax relief. Coalition member and Nebraska Farmers Union president John Hansen says the group is made up of leaders in agriculture, education and public interest. "We've updated the proposal that we had last year and we're working out some of the different revenue amounts for some of the different options we're thinking about including," Hansen says. "So, we're trying to work out those final details." Hansen says they want to improve on a bill that failed to pass in the last legislative session, LB-1084 from Senator Tom Briese of Albion. "1084 did broaden the sales tax base and increased the sales tax rate along with a bunch of elimination of business incentives and income tax exemptions," Hansen says. "We are trying to find a more appropriate revenue fix for how to pay for K-12 education." Hansen says members of the coalition plan to lobby legislators this month.

The McCook Lady Bison volleyball team picked up their first win of the fall season, sweeping Holdrege last night at the MHS gym. The Lady Bison softball team dropped an 8-4 decision at Lexington. The Bison JV's will play in a tournament in Grand Island tomorrow. The Bison football team will travel to York in a battle of Class B top three ranked teams. Wagner Ford pregame on KICX begins at 6. The Lady Bison golf team hits the road to Lexington today while the Bison cross country teams are in Broken Bow tomorrow. The MCC volleyball will host Cloud County tonight at the Graff Events Center.

The No. 7 Nebraska volleyball team rallied from an 0-2 hole to topple No. 14 Creighton, 3-2 (22-25, 19-25, 25-18, 25-22, 15-10), Thursday night in front of a crowd of 14,022 at CHI Health Center Omaha. It was an NCAA record for a women's volleyball regular-season match. Mikaela Foecke had a career-high 25 kills on .351 hitting with 13 digs, five blocks and four service aces to ignite the Huskers (5-1) after a tough start to the match. Freshman Capri Davis had a career-high 18 kills, and Jazz Sweet added 12 kills on .323 hitting for the Big Red.
