

Predicted Coverage Area for WVFT




Building Penetration: Crawfordville, Quincy, Tallahassee, Woodville


Auto Penetration: Bainbridge, Cairo, Chattahoochee, Monticello

Fringe Penetration: Blountstown, Carrabelle, Colquitt, Thomasville




News/Talk Radio Listener Demographics






Audience Educational Level (%)

NIELSEN: RADIO REACHES 93% OF ADULTS

Radio's reach has remained consistent, while television has eroded.

Radio now finds itself as America's #1 Mass Reach Medium.

On 6/23/15, Nielsen released the findings from its Q1 2015 Total Audience Report:

- Radio is #1 in Reach among Adults 18+, 18-34 and 35-49.
- Among Adults 18+ Radio's weekly reach (93%), surpasses TV (87%), Smartphones (70%), Social Networks on Smartphones (61%), PC (54%) and Smartphone video (37%).
- Radio's 18-34 weekly reach advantage over television (93% to 76%) is significant. Among 18-34's, the number of days of weekly usage is led by Smartphones (5.9), followed by Radio (5.0), then Television (4.7).
- Nielsen's new report concludes that radio reaches nearly 223 million adult listeners weekly, which is 93% of all U.S. adults.
- There are a lot of digital platforms out there, but when it comes right down to it, none of them come even remotely close to matching the ubiquitous reach of AM and FM radio. And Radio is the #1 driver to send listeners to digital products.

Bucs games to air on Tallahassee radio

Florida State football fans in the Tallahassee area and south Georgia will be able to tune in and follow quarterback Jameis Winston's rookie season with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

And, of course, they will will hear a familiar voice describing the action — Gene Deckerhoff.

Freedom 93 (WVFT/93.3 FM) is the new radio home of Buccaneers football this season.

Winston was the No. 1 overall selec-

tion by the Bucs in April's NFL Draft, while Deckerhoff, the longtime voice of FSU football and athletics since 1974, is entering his 27th season as the team's play-by-play announcer.

"Just like the rest of Bucs Nation, I can't wait to see him quarterback this football team," said Deckerhoff, who resides in Tallahassee and travels to Bucs games "He certainly brings a lot of interest to fans here."

Tampa Bay games were not broadcast in Tallahassee last season after they were aired in the past by WNLS (1270 AM). Freedom 93 carried the

Jacksonville Jaguars the past two seasons.

Even before the Bucs selected Winston to be their long-awaited franchise quarterback, Freedom 93 regional manager Barry Kaye contacted the Bucs and believed the radio partnership with the organization was a perfect match.

Kaye cited the Bucs' loyal fan base in the area and FSU's longtime player connections over the years.

More than 30 former Seminoles have played for the organization, including Pro Football Hall of Fame (2014) linebacker Derrick Brooks, running back Warrick Dunn and Super Bowl-winning (2002) quarterback Brad Johnson.

"A lot of people look at the Bucs as PSU south, the NFL version of PSU, so it is very exciting for us," Kaye said.

Jeff Ryan, director of broadcast operations for the Bucs, also pointed to the established connection between FSU and the Bucs and the importance of reestablishing ties in the area.

"We thought this would be a good fit. A newer station, it has a very strong (FM) signal and it doesn't hurt that we drafted Winston — and we also have the voice of the Seminoles in Gene," Ryan said.

"We are very, very excited. Tallahassee has been an important market for us." Freedom 93 is one of 14 radio stations in Florida contracted to broadcast Buccaneers games, according to Ryan, Owned by Magic Broadcasting, based in Panama City, Freedom 93 features a news, talk, sports format. It is also home to Florida Gators football and men's basketball.

Winston, the 2013 Heisman Trophy winner who also led the Seminoles to the program's third national title the same year, and the Bucs open their preseason Aug. 15 at Minnesota. They open the regular season Sept. 13 at home against Tennessee.

"Even before we knew what team would draft him, I told people that Jameis Winston will play in a Super Bowl one day," Deckerhoff said. "I am that confident that he will get it done."

The Bucs Stop Here

Freedom93 is Tallahassee's new home for Tampa Bay football

Tt's a big win for Buccaneers football fans in Tallahassee and for local radio station Freedom93 (WVFT ■93.3FM). For general manager, Barry Kaye, the live broadcast of the Buc's games represents another important step toward fulfilling his vision for the station. Tallahassee Family Magazine talked with Kaye recently to find out more about the uniqueness of his approach.

TFM Many people know Freedom93 as a talk radio station, but with the addition of Tampa Bay football live

coverage, you continue to challenge the stereotype.



Kaye From the beginning, I wanted to create a radio station that would better reflect our town and our way of life. Tallahassee is a big sporting community and of course, football is a big part of that. At the same time, we are an academic hub

and are highly engaged in the discussion of the political issues of the day. As the capital city of the third-largest state in the country, we are a power-center of political life. By bringing talk, news, sports and community affairs together within our broadcast, we appeal to this diversity more effectively.

TFM How significant is the fact that Jameis Winston will be the Bucs' quarterback?

Kave There's no doubt that everyone is going to want to know how Jameis performs as a pro, even if you're not a big football fan. The fact that he is playing for a Florida team and brings with him a substantial number of achievements, puts him in an elite status. Having broken several records, going undefeated and winning both the national title and the Heisman trophy has him in the national spotlight, and by extension, Tallahassee and Florida State football are in there with him.

TFM You have an extensive background in radio broadcasting including having managed several stations in the Los Angeles area. Why have you chosen to



many years ago. After living and working in larger cities around the country, we were attracted to this area for many of the same reasons people often mention... the quality of life, the opportunities for new business

and the way people get involved in helping one another. We have not been disappointed and have made a lot of very good friends. For me, the work we are doing at Freedom93 is very personal. Giving back and giving to our listeners with programming that enriches their lives, keeps them informed... maybe even lifts their spirits. That's important. And, that's really how Tallahassee works. It's the people that make this such a special place. And, all the amazing canopy roads, too, of course!

TFM Thinking of that, you have a number of people from our community who are part of your weekly lineup.

Kave Yes, we do, and in fact, they are representative of our diversity of opinion and background. Will Dance who hosts The Will Dance Show weekday mornings is . a former law enforcement officer. John Reid is an attorney who hosts Capital Connections, while Tallahassee Talks is hosted by Brien Sörne who is the CEO of a local marketing firm. Then there's Elton Gumbel, a FAMU grad who provides us his hourly sports reports and Jim McNeill's weekend sports show "The Final Score with Mac & the Mummy. There are many other examples of this cross-representation among our staff as well as our on-air personalities. It gives us a tremendous advantage in bringing our listeners a radio station that is truly, Tallahassee's radio station.
