# (a) Initiative: Internship Program

WYBB and WCOO have operated an internship program for over 20 years, and continued to conduct the program during this reporting period. This program enables high school students, college students and members of the greater Charleston community to gain experience and develop skills necessary for careers in broadcasting. From July 23, 2016 through July 22, 2017, WYBB and WCOO hosted two (2) interns. Both interns gained experience in on-air broadcasting, production and promotions, music scheduling, and working closely with the Operations Manager/WCOO Program Director/WYBB Program Director. Interns were also a major part of the music transfer as the stations switched music automation system this spring. Interns also observed promotional events hosted by the stations over the course of the year.

#### (b) Initiative: Participation in Events Sponsored by Educational Institutions/Organizations

- i. Members of the WYBB and WCOO on-air staff hosted and trained students from the James Island High School on February 2nd, 2017. Students sat in with the afternoon on-air personality to observe on air mechanics and activity. They were taught about careers in broadcasting, including on-air, promotions, production, programming, traffic, and sales.
- ii. On March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017, the Operations Manager for WYBB and WCOO conducted a lecture with the music business program at The College of Charleston. The lecture included information on radio and broadcast employment opportunities.
- iii. August 25th through August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2016, the Operations Manager for WCOO and WYBB hosted and participated in lectures for inspiring musicians, sound engineers, record assistants, and other facets of the music industry at the College of Charleston. The event, called The New Music Confab, enabled students to explore the business side of the music industry.

### (c) Initiative: Participation in Career Fairs

WYBB and WCOO participated in a career fair on October  $27^{th}$  2016 from 11 am-1 pm with The Art Institute of Charleston. WYBB and WCOO attended the event to make the Charleston, North Charleston, Summerville, and surrounding areas aware of the stations' internship program and available employment opportunities with the stations.
