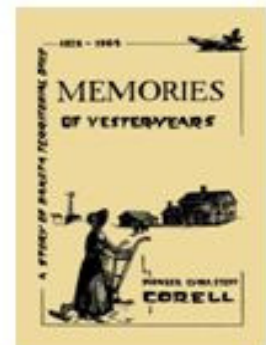
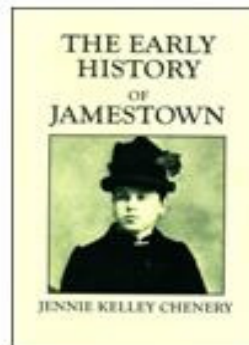
The Stutsman County Memorial Museum thanks you for your past support of our mission to preserve the artifacts and memories of our heritage. During the past year the project to water-proof the north basement wall was completed, it was a bigger job than we expected, leaving a large area of disturbed lawn that needs to be restored this summer. The installation of a lift for handicapped accessibility to the upper level of the Gazebo was completed last summer, this makes the entire Gazebo accessible by all of our patrons. The lower level is designed for buffet style vending, with seating and tables available on the upper level. The projects for this year include repainting of the kitchen and the NW bedroom, installation of a patio area across the front of the building and planters to provide a floral greeting for our visitors. The shrubs across the rear of the property had become very overgrown and unsightly; they were removed last fall in preparation for installation of a new low maintenance wrought iron type fence. The fence has been purchased and will be installed over the summer. As always, our funding for these projects is very limited and we depend on our membership income to be able to complete them. Our board members and greeters spend a great deal of time, energy and often their own funds to maintain the museum as a resource for our community.

Our greeters, Charlie Kourajian, Nora Moran, Marlyn Swanson and Danika Smith look forward to visiting with you over the summer. Charlie plans to do several newsletters over the summer, if you provide your email he will forward one to you!

Our new booklet selection is a collection of poetry, commentary and short fiction by three Jamestown authors, entitled "Three Authors of Jamestown" by Bruce Berg, Bill Kennedy and Keith Norman. Although many of you are likely familiar with other works by these gentlemen, this is their first collaboration and it promises to be very entertaining.
