Heights and diameters at maturity.

The garden has four season appeal: Fragrant spring blossoms; summer annuals and perennials; colorful fall foliage; evergreen trees and shrubs; colorful fruit on flowering crabapples, colorful bark on the Japanese Tree Lilac and red stems on the variegated dogwood during winter season.

A. Concolor Fir: 50' x 30'.. Medium growth rate. Color resembles Colorado Blue Spruce but Concolor Fir is more adaptable and disease resistant.

B. Malus "Donald Wyman 15'x15"  
A flowering crabapple that is compact with white flowers. Fruit hangs well into winter and then is devoured by migrating birds. A highly recommended, disease resistant ornamental tree. Excellent as a specimen or in mass plantings.

C. Viburnum x Judi: 7' x 6'  
Pinkish white flowers in early spring that are intensely fragrant. An attractive shrub when not in bloom.

D. Malus' Adams: 20' x 20'  
A rounded, dense tree that has vivid red buds that open to single red flowers and then change to clear pink. Fruit hangs on the tree through the winter season (winter interest) and relished by migrating birds. Disease resistant.

E. Cushion Yew: 4' x 8' slow growth rate. (Taxus cuspidate cv.) Small evergreen. Easily pruned to a neat round shrub and can be kept smaller than the listed dimensions. Very hardy and long lived.

F. Japanese Lilac: 20' x 15' slow growth rate. Large creamy white fragrant trusses in late June. Very desirable and recommended.

G. Variegated Dogwood: 8' x 6'  
(Cornus Alba cv. Elegantissima) Leaves have irregular creamy white margins and pale, slightly bluish green centers. Striking. Winter stems are red.

H. Northern Bayberry: 9' x 6'  
(Myrica pennsylvanica) The waxy, grayish white, fragrant berries are used to make bayberry candles. The plant and leaves are very aromatic when crushed. Highly recommended and grows well in difficult sites.

The large perennial garden will be colorful with easy care plants and shrubs. The garden will be edged in concrete pieces from the Coastal Mart site.

The annual gardens will have easy care plants that are drought tolerant and self-cleaning, i.e. Purple vinca, dusty miller, et al.

As the trees (flowering crabapples) mature, hostas and other shade loving plants can be planted under the outstretched branches.

The small retaining wall on the east side property line should be removed and replaced with cement blocks (36" high), covered on the west side of the new wall with bricks and capped. The wall would provide additional seating if desired.
