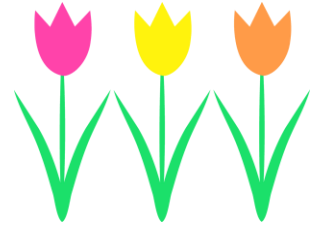

6:30 p.m., See and feel, the various steps from sheep to clothing at a presentation by Grace Tully, Loom House Curator, Kalona Historical Village. She will talk a bit about the history of spinning (it's older than the hills) and show ways to produce two different yarns. Pictures of cute sheep included!



7:30 p.m.: Spindle spinning—for all the times you do not have room for a spinning wheel, do not have time to set up a spinning wheel, or want to be free to roam. Get the basics in a class with all materials (spindle and wools provided). **This class is limited to 7 students.**

Cost: 6:30 presentation is free to PHSM members; \$5 for non-members.

7:30 class is limited to 7 people. \$75 for PHSM members; \$90 for non-members. Registration fee includes spindles to keep and various fibers to practice on. If you have your own spindle to bring, deduct \$10 from the cost. Please register at appropriate times and dates (see below).

Come view the movie that set the film industry on its head. “Loving Vincent” is the world’s first fully painted movie, using the techniques and colors that Vincent van Gogh used in his own paintings. Each of the film’s 65,000 frames is a full painting—a film that explores the life of van Gogh, his creativity, and the demons that plagued him before his eventual suicide. Winner of several awards, including being nominated as Best Animated Feature by the Academy Awards. **Cost:** Free and open to the public.
