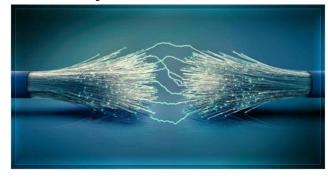

 - 10% poor condition

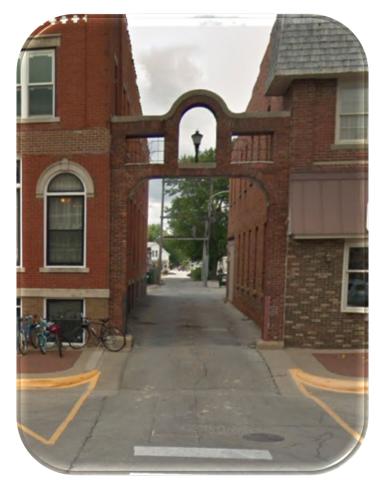

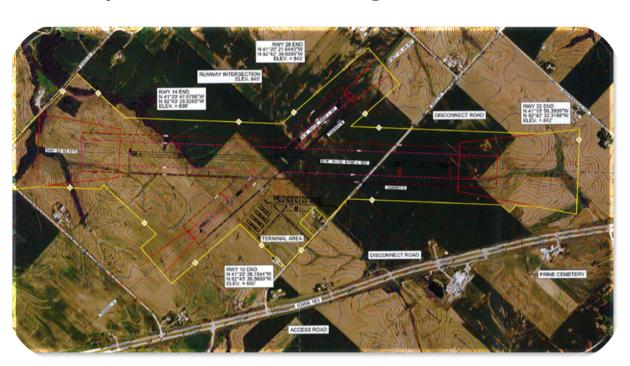

- Available debt capacity \$45 million



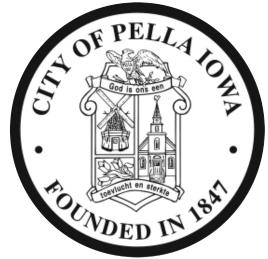
Finances CHALLENGES

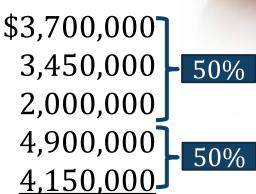

Estimated Property Tax Impacts



- For every \$10 million in debt issued above the city's financial contribution, the estimated annual property tax increase on a \$200,000 home is \$106
- For every \$100,000 in operating deficits for new facilities,
 the estimated annual property tax increase on a \$200,000 home is \$18

Law Enforcement Accreditation and CALEA



The gold standard- a best practices approach

11 out of 177 agencies in lowa are accredited.

Legally defensible

Professional standards

Meet community expectations/ Transparency

180 Standards (Proofs) each year

This process is an annual repeating cycle

Three years for initial accreditation award in 2024

Four years for re-accreditation in 2028

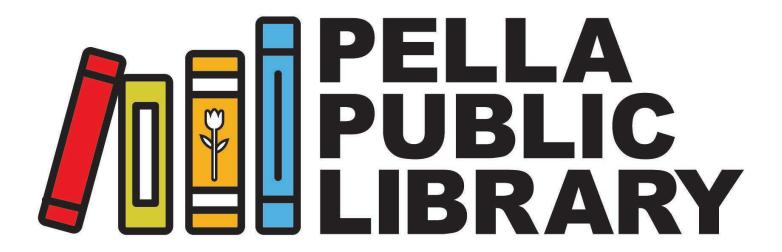
- Initial preparation and revision costs generally apply to physical improvements. These projects are completed, or already funded.
 - Jail/ structure renovation
 - Communications security
 - Facility controlled access and security
 - Firing range renovations
- Moving forward, predictable costs
 - Annual budgeted CALEA costs-\$4,700 to \$5,500
 - Training
 - Office of Professional Standards
 - Evidence tracking and security
 - Policy development is continuous
 - Recruiting and hiring

2022-2023 Strategic Planning Work Sessions – Library



Spaces & Places IRL & online

- The primary broad initiative that has been identified by the Library Board is broadly the use of spaces and places
- This service response will address the design and use of the Library building, as well as our online presence and electronic resources, and our presence in the community through outreach programs and new and ongoing partnerships



2022-2023 *Public Works* – *Streets*



- 143 lane miles of public streets
- Goal: reconstruct 3,700 to 7,400 LF annually
 - \$2.4 to \$4.8 million for total reconstruction (\$650/LF)
 - Asphalt overlays extend usable life by 15 years (\$75-\$100/LF)
- Traffic signals at four CBD intersections nearing end of life (\$1.4 million)

Request for increased fireflows

Lead Services

- IDNR & EPA will require inventorying of existing private lead services and implement a plan to replace them
- Some communities may subsidize costs





2022-2023 Public Works – Wastewater



Potential treatment standard mandates

- New NPDES permit requirements
- IDNR nutrient reduction
 - \$5.6 million; 2031 required deadline for full compliance
- Inflow & Infiltration (I&I) IDNR mandate
 - Need to construct secondary storm and storm sewers in a lot of neighborhoods
 - City cost: \$10,000 to \$20,000 per block
 - Private cost: \$2,500 to \$6,500 per home





2022-2023 Community Services



Memorial Building

 2021 engineering evaluation identified exterior repairs, roofing and soffit, chimney and other structural repairs needed to maintain the integrity of the structure.

Pella Aquatic Center

- Commercial robotic pool vacuum to increase cleanliness of the indoor/outdoor pool basins and reduce labor hours.
- The indoor pool basin will need to be renovated if a new indoor facility is not constructed in the next 2 to 3 years.

Parks Department and Golf & Athletic Fields - 473 acres of parks/rec grounds and 10 facilities

Parks Department - 1 FTE General Laborer Position

- The increase in facilities and amenities over the past few years is driving the need for an additional FT position.
- Wonder Spelen project added an estimated 797 annual labor hours for park and facility maintenance.
- Proposed Southside Beautification project will add another 1,680 hours annually.

Golf and Athletic Fields - 1 FTE Equipment Technician

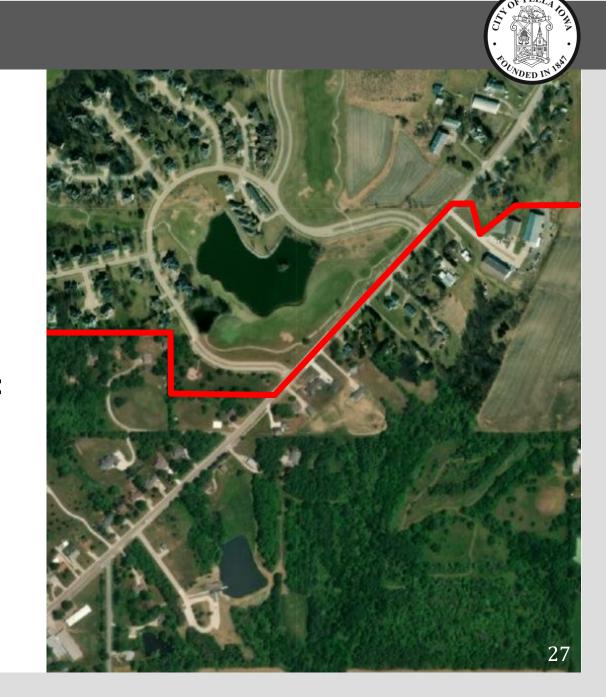
- Maintenance of over 45 vehicles and large equipment, dozens of smaller equipment and 3 large scale irrigation systems.
- The size of the fleet and the extensive irrigation systems require dedicated personnel to manage and proactively service.

Pella Soccer Complex

If the intent is to continue to utilize the Pella Soccer Complex, the irrigation system will need to be replaced.

2022-2023 *Planning* & *Zoning*

- Idaho Drive annexation
- Adopt the current version of the Uniform Building Code
- Update the Building Department and Planning Department fees/forms
- Overhaul the following City Code sections:
 - Subdivisions
 - Definitions of Terms
 - Signs
 - Supplemental Site Development
 Accessory Buildings



2022-2023 *Electric*



Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI)

- AMI uses Pella Fiber to provide detailed data
- Customers access data from a web portal
- Outage management program
- Missouri River Energy Services will be adopting time of use metering on January 1, 2023
