1:00 – 1:45 Presentation: George Washington Carver in Iowa, Lekberg Hall, Simpson College

Linda Griffith Smith, of Madison County Historical Society, will discuss the remarkable story of George Washington Carver and his time in lowa. Born into slavery in Missouri, George moved multiple times before coming to lowa in 1888 at 24 years of age.

2:00 – 3:00 Performance: Listening to the Still Small Voice: The Story of George Washington Carver, Lekberg Hall, Simpson College

Performed by Paxton Williams. This is the story of one of the most inspiring and enigmatic renaissance men of the 20th century. As you travel from Civil War-era Missouri, to Carver's Laboratory, to the halls of Congress, you will see the trials, tribulations, and ultimate triumph of the scientist/educator/artist known as the "Wizard of Tuskegee."

3:00 – 4:00 Simpson College Self-Guided Tour.

Visit six historical landmarks on campus that relate to Carver. Tour stops will be marked and information will be available at Lekberg Hall and the Matthew Simpson Room in College Hall.
