*We want to make the display in the Art Hall at the Greene County Fair the best we have ever had. This can only be done with your cooperation. Please bring in as many articles as you have in your possession and want to enter in competition.*

### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 Exhibitors should read the Association General Rules and Regulations, the Art Hall General Rules and Regulations and specific rules in each Division.
- 2 Competition is open to residents of Greene County only, in accordance with each department specifications.
- 3 Entries, deadline hours and days, and judging is as follows. For all departments, entry hours are 10am to 7:00pm on Thursday. Judging will be completed Friday.
- 4 Checkout times are 4pm to 5pm Sunday. No articles can be removed before 4pm. Those not called for by such time will be subject to owner's risk and available at the Secretary's office. All premiums will be paid at checkout time only.
- 5 The textiles and fabrics should be clean.
- 6 No items will be accepted that have won previously.
- 7 See Department E - Junior Citizen, for special entries available. Two age groups are available, junior citizens: age 2 through 10 years and 11 through 16 years of age.
- 8 See Department and Class rules for number of entries per class per exhibitor. Unless otherwise noted, entries are limited to one per exhibitor per class.
- 9 When there is only one entry of its kind, the judge is not to award a premium unless one is deserved. Any premium may be withheld at the discretion of the judge.
- 10 Outstanding ribbons will be withheld at the discretion of the judge.
- 11 There is no entry fee for any exhibitor in the Art Hall.
- 12 The judges may have written comments after judging if requested by the exhibitor or department superintendent.
- 13 The Fair Management will take every precaution against loss, breakage, damage or theft but will not be responsible should such occur.
- 14 For perishable foods, exhibitors will have the option of taking home all but a small display portion of their exhibit or leave their exhibit for visitors to sample.

## People's Choice Quilt Block

1. Exhibitors may enter a (1) 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" quilt block in this division.
2. The quilt block must be made by the exhibitor.
3. Entries will be accepted Thursday during the Greene County Fair in Clover Hall at the Open Class area or at the Stitch during normal store hours.
4. Voting will be done by the public during fair hours. The public will be asked to judge on neatness, use of color and eye appeal. Each quilt block will be given a number corresponding to a container with slot in the lid. To make a vote, simply drop a coin in the container of your favorite quilt number.

1 penny = 1 vote  
 1 nickel = 5 votes  
 1 dime = 10 votes  
 1 quarter = 25 votes

When the voting has been completed, the quilt block receiving the most votes will be declared the winner.

- 5 Quilt blocks will be used for the next year's quilt raffle.

- 6 Youth exhibit entries are open to youth up to 16 years of age.
- 7 No items will be accepted that have won previously.
- 8 No entries can be removed until Sunday evening. All premiums will be paid at check-out time.
- 9 For perishable food, exhibitors will have the option of taking home all but a small display portion of their exhibit or leave their exhibit for visitors to sample.

## DEPARTMENT F - FLORICULTURE

Superintendent – Jean Walker & Marilyn Lawton

- 1 Participants may enter more than one entry in each class as long as it represents a different color or species. Exception: Only 1 entry is allowed per exhibitor in Division 5.
- 2 Entries in specimen classes must have been grown by the exhibitor. Entries should be labeled as to variety, if possible, for educational purposes. Know the names of your entry and know what you are entering.
- 3 Foliage can be used in all arrangement classes. No artificial flowers, leaves or noxious weeds can be used. To obtain a definition of a noxious weed, go to [www.weeds.iastate.edu/reference/weedlaw.htm](http://www.weeds.iastate.edu/reference/weedlaw.htm).
- 4 Entries not conforming to the general rules of the schedule will be disqualified by the classification committee.
- 5 In Horticulture specimens, the flowers own foliage must be left attached to the stems. (Uniform in stem and flower).
- 6 The management reserves the right to remove any unsightly or deteriorated entry or to refresh the same for the duration of the show. None will be touched or moved before judging is completed.
- 7 Clean all samples of dirt. Remove all damaged foliage and spray residue. Cleanliness increases points in judging. No leaves in water. All containers must be clean and presentable.
- 8 You must keep to the listings.
- 9 Do not use accessories with your plants or samples.
- 10 Artistic design is most important in Division 5 and Division 9 and receives the majority of points.
- 11 During and after judging, the superintendent will be informed by the judge and available for information pertaining to the finer points of a flower show.

- 1 Exhibitors must be residents of Greene County or members of the Greene County Genealogical Society.
- 2 Each exhibit MUST have attached an explanation/genealogical connection of why it is important to the exhibitor including the 5 'W's' in the explanation of Who, What, Where, When, and Why. Information needs to show relationship and be understandable as a standalone exhibit.
- 3 It is strongly suggested that sheet protectors or sandwich type bags be used for protection. Lamination is not recommended.
- 4 Copies of documents are preferred, either computer generated or photocopies. Original documents are discouraged.
- 5 No entries will be accepted by mail.
- 6 No more than 1 entry per class per exhibitor.
- 7 There will be two age divisions in each class: adult and junior (16 years of age and under)
- 8 Judging is based on the item as described in the class and the genealogical value of the item, not on the age or presentation. If entries don't qualify or are not an acceptable standard, placing may be withheld.
