

Blackgum (Medium)

Height: 30-50' **Spread:** 20-30' **Shape:** Round **Foliage:** Green Leaves **Fall Foliage:** Red, Orange, Yellow, Purple **Exposure:** Full-Partial Sun. This low-maintenance deciduous tree has a slow growth-rate but needs room to grow. Tiny flowers in the Spring give way to small dark blue fruits that are edible but sour and attract birds and other wildlife.



Tulip Tree (Large)

Height: 60-90' **Spread:** 30-50' **Shape:** Pyramidal/Broad Conical **Foliage:** Large 4-lobed Green **Fall Foliage:** Golden Yellow **Exposure:** Full Sun. This deciduous tree trunk may reach 4-6' in diameter. Named for cup-shaped, tulip-like yellow flowers that bloom in the spring. Flowers are followed by cone-shaped brown fruits.

Scarlet Oak (Large)

Height: 60-80' **Spread:** 40-50' **Shape:** Round **Foliage:** Deep Green on Top/Light Green on Bottom **Fall Foliage:** Scarlet **Exposure:** Full Sun. Provides brilliant red fall color that lasts well into winter, yields acorns (attracting songbirds, wild turkeys, squirrels, deer), develops an open crown-providing light shade and should not be planted in alkaline soil.

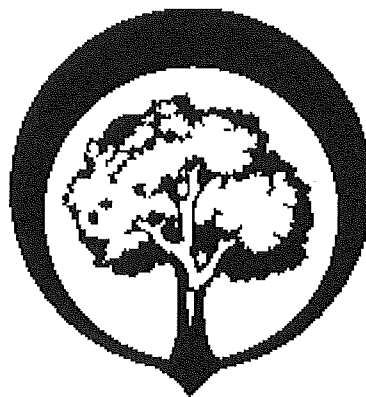


White Pine (Large)

Height: 50-80' **Spread:** 20-40' **Shape:** Oval, Pyramidal **Foliage:** Long, Slender Blue-Green Needles, Cones **Fall Foliage:** Green **Exposure:** Full Sun-Partial Shade. The Blackgum transplants easily, works well for windbreaks, and is a hardy, valuable tree. It is also sensitive to air pollution, road salt, and soil compaction.

Bald Cypress (Large)

Height: 50-70' **Spread:** 20-30' **Shape:** Pyramidal **Foliage:** Green Needles **Fall Foliage:** Russet-red **Exposure:** Full Sun. This stately conifer, often is found in groupings in parks and larger spaces, along streets, and around lakes. Unlike most cone-bearing trees, bald-cypress loses its needles each winter and grows a new set in spring.
