The Blue Water River Walk is almost one-mile of St. Clair River shoreline immediately south of the mouth of the Black River in Port Huron, Michigan. It is less than a mile downriver from the Blue Water Bridge to Sarnia and the southern end of Lake Huron. Owned by the Community Foundation of St. Clair County, the Blue Water River Walk is open to the public year-round.

The shoreline used to create this beautiful River Walk was donated to the Community Foundation of St. Clair County by local philanthropist James C. Acheson at Christmas of 2011.

Observation Dock: the old railroad ferry dock, which dates back to the early 1900's, has been fully restored and re-opened to the public. Once used to help transport goods back-and-forth to Sarnia, the Ferry Dock is now a beautiful patio overlooking the St. Clair River.

Pedestrian Trail: using partial funding from the Transportation Enhancement Grant Program of MDOT, the Community Foundation raised matching private donations that allowed us to build a 10' wide asphalt pedestrian trail along the entire length of the shoreline. This trail is a key component of the Bridge to Bay Trail system.

Outdoor Classroom: At the north end of the River Walk, just north of the Observation Dock, is our Outdoor Classroom. Intended as a true interactive learning environment, the Outdoor Classroom is meant to teach the public about the St. Clair River ecosystem and the plant and wildlife habitat found along the River Walk.

Shoreline & Habitat Restoration: Approximately 4,300 feet of St. Clair River shoreline was completely restored and rehabilitated in 2013, utilizing the grant funding from the GLRI. In the spring of 2014 we completed our shallow water habitat restoration efforts. During this work, and including the Pilot Phase work done in 2012, almost 7,000 tons of debris was removed from the site.

County Wetlands Park: Our partners at St. Clair County Parks & Recreation received a \$1 million grant to develop a new wetlands park on the very southern end of the River Walk

Fishing Pier: To help enhance public access for fishing and recreation, the Community Foundation built a fishing pier on the southern end of the River Walk.

Public Art: One of the many fantastic enhancements of the Blue Water River Walk is public art. Adding public art and artifacts is another way we have been able to embellish our River Walk and make it more interesting for visitors.




Friday, June 27th Cruise Night

Fort Gratiot Lighthouse

Michigan's Oldest Working Lighthouse

The original Fort Gratiot Lighthouse was established in 1825 to guard the juncture of Lake Huron and the St. Clair River. That lighthouse was destroyed by a storm in 1828 and the current lighthouse, the oldest in Michigan, was built north of the fort in 1829. The white painted brick tower was extended from 74' to its present 86' in the early 1860s. The green flashing light was automated in 1933 and updated in 2016 and can be seen from 16 miles out in Lake Huron.

The entire campus has undergone a historic restoration

under the ownership of St. Clair County Parks & Recreation Commission and the Port Huron Museum.

Weather permitting, the Fort Gratiot Lighthouse is one of the few operating lighthouses that allow visitors to climb the tower and step out onto the catwalk for a breathtaking view. From the gallery, visitors can view the Blue Water Bridge, the mouth of the St. Clair River, Point Edward, Ontario and Lake Huron to the north.

Hosted by Citizens for a Vibrant Community, Art on the River is the second weekend in June near Downtown Port Huron, along the shores of the St. Clair River on Merchant Street and in Kiefer Park.

Art on the River is a family friendly event with art workshops, hands-on art, music to dance to and food to enjoy.

This year Art on the River features Margaret (Candy) Paeth as the featured artist. Candy is a member of the Blue Water Art Association and features her art all around the Blue Water Area. Candy is supported by the Arts Council of the Community Foundation of St. Clair County. Special guest artist is Anthony Strublic. Tony is the Great Lakes Maritime Artist. His drawings feature many of the freighters that travel the great lakes. Tony is sponsored by Advia Credit Union.

Art on the River has a huge band line up for 2024. Headliners include Brotha Earth (known as Rare Earth early on in their careers) and Bobby Murray band. Bobby is known for playing guitar for Etta James and has several Grammy awards!

Float Down

It's the Blue Water Area's favorite unorganized, unsanctioned, and unsponsored event ... it's called the Port Huron Float Down, and it somehow seems to take place every third Sunday in August, despite a cancellation each and every year by the United States Coast Guard.

Sunday, August 17th

The event sees 3,000 or more people gathering at Lighthouse Beach in the early afternoon and floating down the St. Clair River to Marysville. There's even a website, but those who run it at porthuronfloatdown.com say they are in no way organizing, sponsoring, planning, or promoting the community event.

According to the site, the Float Down is a tradition steeped in history, even though it's impossible to know who the first people were to float down. The event, as it's known today, dates back over 30 years. In 1986, a storm put an end to the fun, and it was officially ended by the United States Coast Guard in 1987. Although people continued to float every year, the Float Down did not officially resurface until 2008.

The traditional course of the Float Down is launching at Lighthouse (Conger) Beach, and then floating 8-miles downstream to Chrysler Beach in Marysville. The current moves quickest under the Blue Water Bridges, and then pulls you out towards the center of the river, near the mouth of the Black River. If you want to watch, the Edison Parkway, the Flag Plaza, the Blue Water Bridges, Pine Grove Park, Kiefer Park, or Lincoln Park are all the best places to watch the floaters

If you decide to float down the St. Clair River in August, there are several things you must consider before jumping in. The current is swift and the water is cold. All floaters should have a reliable inflatable and a paddle so they are able to stay out of the shipping channel. It's wise to choose a float that can keep you dry and out of the water to prevent heat loss or hypothermia. Floaters should have a Personal Floatation Device or a Life Jacket. Children should wear them at all times and adults should at least keep them at an arm's-length reach at all times. Most importantly, if you cannot swim, do not enter the water. There are no lifeguards or safety personnel.

This year's Port Huron to Mackinac race will be the 101st consecutive year when the sailboats leave the starting line in southern Lake Huron on Saturday, July 20th. OVER 200 boats are expected to compete in this year's race. The boats are measured to determine handicaps, which are subtracted from their elapsed sailing time, except for the scratch boat. The scratch boat is the fastest boat in the fleet and is granted no time allowance handicap.

The Port Huron to Mackinac race features two courses:

- The Shore Course (smaller boats) 235 miles
- The Cove Island Course (larger boats) 298 miles







Freighter Watching

Whenever I show someone new around town, the conversation inevitably turns to the elephant in the room, or should I say, elephant in the river. So, I've compiled some answers below regarding one of the area's favorite past times, freighter watching.

Wow, that's a big boat! Technically it's a ship, and yes, it's big. They range in size from

about 500 to 1,000 feet in length and 67 to 105 feet wide.

What's inside? Most freighters on the Great Lakes are bulk carriers, meaning they carry a large volume of relatively low value cargo that is used in the production of more complex, higher value products. Common commodities hauled on the lakes include iron ore, salt, sand, limestone, coal, and grain.

Where are they going? Generally speaking, the bulk commodities are often loaded on the upper Great Lakes and then transported to the population and industrial areas on the lower lakes. Iron ore, for example, is mined in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan and Northeast Minnesota.

Why do you see so many around here? The St. Clair River is a very popular trade route as it connects Lake Huron to Lake St. Clair. Freighters destined for Lake Erie, Lake Ontario, or

even the Atlantic Ocean must first pass through Port Huron as part of their journey.

So these ships can go into the ocean? There are size limitations along the St. Lawrence Seaway, so only smaller freighters (less than 740 feet) can make it all the way to the Ocean.

How can I tell what ship is from what country? Each vessel has a

unique name, often in honor of a person, company, or place. On the stern of the ship, the home port is also displayed, as well as a flag from the country of origin.

Where's the best place to view these ships? Port Huron's Thomas Edison Parkway, beneath the Blue Water Bridge, is a favorite spot to park and watch the ships go by.

How can I learn more about freighters? To learn more about the history of the Great Lakes and the ships that sailed on them, visit the Port Huron Museum's James C. Acheson Marine Gallery on the second floor of the Carnegie Center. The Fort Gratiot Light Station County Park is on the grounds of a former coast guard station and home to Michigan's oldest lighthouse. You'll also want to visit the Huron Light Ship, a former "floating lighthouse" now on permanent display near Pine Grove Park in Port Huron.







Sanilac County Historic Village & Museum

Discover the Legacy of Sanilac County at Sanilac County Historic Village & Museum

For over 60 years, the Sanilac County Historical Society has served as a cornerstone of community heritage and grassroots success. Entirely self-funded and volunteer-driven, the Society has transformed its humble beginnings into a 10-acre campus featuring 17 historic buildings—now known as Sanilac County Historic Village & Museum. Each building tells a unique story of local and national significance.

At the front of the Historic Village stands the museum: The Loop-Harrison Mansion, an 1872 Victorian home that once belonged to Sanilac's pioneering physician and Civil War veteran, Joseph Loop and wife Jane. Hosting over three dozen annual events—from historical tours and educational lectures to live concerts and holiday celebrations—the Museum connects the past with the present. It also opens its scenic grounds for private rentals, making it a sought-after location for weddings, receptions, and gatherings of all kinds.

The Sanilac County Museum's enduring success is a testament to the passion of its volunteers, members, donors, and generations of supporters. In partnership with groups like the Barn Theatre and Port Sanilac Farmers Market, the Museum remains a vibrant guardian of Sanilac County's rich cultural heritage.















St. Clair is located at the center of the memorable Blue Water Area. It is an area rich in history dating back to pre-Revolutionary War times and was a major stop for the underground railroad of the Civil War era.

As a boating enthusiast, you'll fall in love with the Saint Clair Boat Harbor with its 120 boat slips. And, if you're a golfer, don't forget the clubs, there are a number of popular courses.

Algonac is situated on the largest fresh-water delta in the world and is nicknamed the "Venice of Michigan" due to the many canals that wind throughout the city and the beautiful boardwalk along the St. Clair River. Algonac's nautical history includes being the birthplace of Chris Craft Boats and former home of Gar Wood, a well-known builder and racer of power boats. Algonac hosts an annual festival in the summer, the Pickerel Tournament, which includes a fishing tournament, carnival, and fireworks.





Paddling the Port Huron State Game Area

Natural scenes that you may have thought could only be found in northern Michigan are just a short drive west of Port Huron. The Port Huron State Game Area is over 6,000 acres and located along the Black River in Clyde and Grant Townships. The site offers opportunities for small game hunting, fishing, hiking, and nature study. The best way to take advantage of all the game area has to offer is by canoe or kayak. Since it is protected state land, many miles of the river are undeveloped and it's more likely that you'll encounter a bald eagle than a fellow human being.

Information on weather conditions as well as the depth and speed of the water at the Jeddo Bridge gauging station is available at https://waterdata.usgs.gov. Access to the river is possible at the Jeddo Bridge, Comstock Bridge, Norman Bridge, M-136/Beard Bridge, Woodsong County Park and Wadhams Bridge (listed from north to south according to the map to the left).

Island Loop Route National Water Trail

The Island Loop National Water Trail is the first national water trail in Michigan and one of only fourteen in the nation. The 10.2 mile long trail provides boaters and paddlers with a one-of-a-kind opportunity to navigate four bodies of water, pass by Michigan's oldest lighthouse and travel underneath the Blue Water Bridges.

Most of the water trail meanders through Fort Gratiot Township, Port Huron Township and the City of Port Huron, traveling the Black River, the Black River Canal, Lake Huron and the St. Clair River. With the exception of the waters under the Blue Water Bridge and in the St. Clair River, waterways along the route are calm and slow but you should wear a life

jacket (PFD) at all times. Also be sure to have your ID with you, as the waters of Lake Huron and the St. Clair River are patrolled by Border Patrol Agents and they can stop you at any time and ask for proof of your citizenship.

Begin your journey either at the new Bakers Field Park in Port Huron Township or at the North River Road Park in Ft. Gratiot Township. Both sites have an ADA accessible kayak launches. Head downriver then east on the canal that links the Black River to Lake Huron. Enter Lake Huron after passing under the Taintor Gate. The Taintor Gate is open 96% of the time but be aware that it closes automatically when there is a strong North or Northeast wind.



Once in Lake Huron, head south and paddle under the Blue Water Bridges and into the St. Clair River, along the international border with Canada. The St. Clair River section should only be attempted by experienced paddlers on a calm day. The water can be quite rough and the paddle is best attempted in the morning. Finish by entering the mouth of the Black River to the west, paddling through the City of Port Huron and then you're back to where you started from.

Blue Water Fishing

You don't need a boat to fish, but if you have one there are many boat launches throughout the area. In many of the Blue Water communities, there are long stretches of public seawall available to the shore fishermen. Whether you're catching fish out of your boat or from the shore, it will require a stop at one of the local bait and tackle stores to get the "good stuff' and info on local tried and true techniques and advice on fishing from the seawalls. Depending on the time of year, you could catch King salmon, Chinook salmon, Atlantic salmon, Steelhead, Brown Trout, Lake Trout, Walleye, Silver Bass, Small Mouth Bass, Sturgeon, Whitefish, Muskie, Northern Pike, Suckers, and Carp.


Golf

Wadhams to Avoca Trail

The 12 mile long Wadhams to Avoca trail begins just west of Port Huron and ends in the small community of Avoca. Built in the late 1800s by the Flint and Pere Marquette Railroad, the former railroad grade was purchased by the St. Clair County Parks and Recreation Commission in 1999 to be developed into a pedestrian pathway. Access points, including parking lots and restrooms, are located at Wadhams Road, Lapeer Road, Imlay City Road, and at M-136 in Avoca. As you trek west along the Wadhams to Avoca Trail from Port Huron, you'll notice the landscape of St. Clair County change from suburban to rural to wilderness. The eastern half of the trail is paved, while the western portion is made of limestone fines to accommodate horseback riders. The pinnacle of your journey west will be the Mill Creek Trestle, a 640 foot long and 60 foot high former railroad bridge that offers spectacular views of the Mill Creek and beyond.

Bridge to Bay Trail

The Bridge to Bay Trail is a 54 mile long network of trails through several communities on St. Clair County's shoreline. The trail starts near the Blue Water Bridge in Port Huron and travels south to Anchor Bay on Lake St. Clair. It passes through the waterfront communities of Marysville, St. Clair, Marine City, and Algonac. Along the way you'll encounter parks, beaches, museums, lighthouses, shops, and restaurants. Many miles of the Bridge to Bay trail are paved pathways for hiking and biking. Other portions of the trail consist of dedicated bike lanes and sidewalks. Some sections remain under development, and completing the gaps in the trail network remain a priority for local

stakeholders. A portion of the Bridge to Bay Trail in Port Huron consists of the Blue Water River Walk, a prime example of the ongoing effort to restore our shoreline. Starting at the mouth of the Black River and ending at the Seaway Terminal, the Blue Water River Walk tells the story of our river's industrial and natural past.

Pine River Nature Center

St. Clair County Regional Education Service Agency's Pine River Nature Center is located on Castor Road immediately south of Goodells County Park. The 80 acre nature center has over three miles of hiking trails that are open year round from dawn to dusk. The nature center is also a popular spot for bird watchers with more than 70 species of birds sighted at the property. Numerous educational programs for area students and the public take place inside the nature center's 5,000 square foot log cabin which features interactive nature displays. More information on the Pine River Nature Center can be found at sccresa.org.

Columbus County Park

Located along the Belle River off of Bauman Road near Richmond in St. Clair County's Columbus Township, Columbus County Park offers four season fun for the whole family! With over 400 acres to explore, Columbus County Park is sure to give you that "Up North" feel. Hiking trails offer scenic views of the Belle River as well as native hardwood forests. Mountain bikers and horseback riders will also find many miles of trails to enjoy. Columbus County Park also features a sledding hill, disk golf course, and modern facilities available for rent. The park is open daily 8am to 9pm May through September and 8am to 8pm October through April.

Blue Water Bridge Crossing

The Blue Water Bridge is an international crossing between the United States of America and the Dominion of Canada. As you enter either country you will be stopped and questioned prior to entry into that country. Each person in your vehicle must be able to prove their citizenship. For a complete list of Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative-compliant documents, visit the United States Department of Homeland Security at dhs.gov/files/crossingborders/travelers.shtm.

Identification Requirements from cbp.gov.

What types of documents are accepted for entry into the United States via land and sea?

U.S. citizens can present a valid: U.S. Passport; Passport Card; Enhanced Driver's License; Trusted Traveler Program card (NEXUS, SENTRI or FAST), American Indian Card or Enhanced Tribal Card.

- U.S. and Canadian citizen children under the age of 16 (or under 19, if traveling with a school, religious group, or other youth group) need only present a birth certificate or other proof of citizenship. The birth certificate can be original, photocopy, or certified copy.
- WHTI does not affect U.S. Lawful Permanent Residents, who are still required to present their permanent resident card (Form I-551) or other valid evidence of permanent residence status.
- Canadian citizens can present a valid passport, Enhanced Driver's License, or Trusted Traveler Program card (NEXUS, SENTRI or FAST).
