ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO REQUIRE DUMPSTER BINS ON MULTI-FAMILY UNITS AND

MOBILE HOME PARKS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHURCH POINT, proceeding under its legal authority to perform certain actions that are in the best interests of the Town of Church Point and further pursuant to the laws of the State of Louisiana hereby state the following:

WHEREAS, The Town has observed and received complaints in reference to a large amount trash receptacles being left on the roadway near multi-family unit properties and mobile home parks, which pose a danger to passing motorists and pedestrians.

WHEREAS, The Town has observed and received complaints of loose garbage, home articles, refuse, furnishings, and mattresses being left on the right of way, sidewalks, and roadway adjacent to and interspersed with the trash receptacles.

WHEREAS, The Town of hereby requires all Multi-Family Units and Mobile Home Parks to have an onsite dumpster bin to allow for trash to be deposited into the receptacle and not left on the roadway, sidewalk and right of way.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED,

Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances: All ordinances and laws or parts of ordinances and laws not specifically noted above which conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Severability: In the event any section, part or portion of this ordinance shall be found to be unconstitutional, or otherwise unenforceable, the remaining portion shall be valid and in full force and effect.

Any Mobile Home Park with 4 or more mobile homes on a single property and any multi- family residence of 4 or more units shall be required to have a dumpster bin on site for the collection of loose waste. Loose waste shall not be deposited upon the right of way, side walk, or road-way for trash collection at any Mobile Home Park with 4 or more mobile homes or any multi-family residence of 4 or more units on a single property.

Any person, partnership, or corporation who violates this provision shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine no exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or thirty (30) days in jail. Each week that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offence.
