Attached are the quotes for 10 exterior cameras, if there are any interior ones needing replacement please let me know as that would drop the price; interior cameras don't require a mount and are also cheaper cameras (not water resistant, no heating pad included).

As mentioned, these cameras are older models that are still covered under the 10-Year Warranty and replaced with the newer models if they ever fail.

The hope here would be to take advantage of the savings here and have them installed when able, it's just running cable as seen with the trial that was set up. I'll give you a call to sync on this one, looking forward to hearing your thoughts.

The real value is that you would no longer need servers to maintain tied to cameras, and tying these cameras into other projects like panic buttons, camera monitoring, access control and more.
