# **Outdoor Report**

The week of April 9, 2018

  - The 2018 snow goose conservation order is open statewide from Feb 19th-May 8<sup>th</sup>.
- Only snow geese, blue geese and Ross' geese may be harvested during the conservation order.

#### Aberdeen Area

#### **Fishing Report**:

Fishing pressure has been low on all area lakes due to deteriorating ice. Please use caution.



Light Goose: With the recent wintery weather the snow geese have pushed south again. There are still a few small flocks of snow geese in the Scatterwood Lake area.

**Turkey**: Archery season only – there's a few turkeys up in the Hecla area and over by the Willow Dam GPA. No turkey hunting activity has been observed this past week due to the weather.

### Clark County

#### Fishing Report:

Dry Lake #2: Fishermen are catching a few perch. The walleye bite has been at dark and later. **Indian Springs:** The walleye bite has been good at dark in 4-6 feet of water. **Reid Lake:** Fishermen are finding a few good walleye at dark and later.



#### **Hunting Report:**

Light goose: There are still a good number of snow geese moving through the area. Recent storms have pushed some geese back south. With warmer temperatures later this week, there should be a good movement of geese through the area.

Turkey: Turkey season is off to a slow start due to recent weather events.

## **Codington County**

#### **Fishing Report:**

Fishing pressure still low on all area lakes.



## **Hunting Report:**

Light Goose: Recent storms have pushed a lot of geese back south, but there are still a few good flocks around the area. Warmer temperatures later in the week may bring in a few more flocks of geese. **Turkey**: Turkey season is off to a slow start due to recent weather events.

#### 🔈 Fishing Report:

**Poinsett**: Fishing activity has picked up some due to nice weather. Fishermen are picking up some walleye in the mornings and evenings.



### **Hunting Report:**

Light Goose: There are very few light geese left in the area. With better weather to come hopefully more will move back in.

**Turkey**: The Turkey population looks good this year for harvesting some birds. Birds have been seen moving in the morning and evening hours.

# Marshall County



Very little fishing activity has been observed in Marshall County.



#### Hunting Report:

**Light Goose:** A few pockets of snow geese have been observed in the county. Hopefully, in the next few weeks the majority of Snow geese will come back north.

**Turkey**: Hunters had limited success. Sounds like birds are not being responsive to calls. The birds observed are still in winter flocks and have not spread out yet.



- The 90 Day reservation window for campsites and camping cabins will be open April 13 for an arrival date of July 12<sup>th</sup> and earlier.
- **Pelican Lake Recreation Area** there has been an influx of hawks, falcons, and owls in the park following the migration of waterfowl and prairie bird species. This has been a cool sight and worth coming to the park to see! The trails are a great place to go for a walk and see these birds up close.
- The recent snowfall still provides a little cross country skiing and snowshoeing on the trails at our parks in the area. The parks are a great place to see migrating eagles, waterfowl and other birds.
