Analysis of effective EEO Recruitment Program

The vacancies filled were for the positions of Sales Representatives and News Director at Thunderbolt Broadcasting. Local newspaper "help wanted" and "display ads" and their associated on-line websites have proven effective in providing candidates for these types of openings. In addition, the company websites, WCMT.com, thunderboltradio.com and Center Point Business Solutions generated additional resumes. On- air radio announcements were used to encourage prospective job seekers to email their resumes to jobs@wcmt.com or to bring resumes to our studios or to mail them to the company's offices in Union City and Martin, Tennessee.

The Thunderbolt Broadcasting Company radio station websites have proven beneficial in generating applications. No organization or special groups requested notice of any job openings.

During the past reporting period Thunderbolt Broadcasting has participated in local "career fairs". Thunderbolt Broadcasting maintains a relationship with the local university and local school educators, keeping open dialogue concerning part-time job opportunities for students who may have an interest in broadcasting. Also local educators are in our studios regularly and are well acquainted with Thunderbolt Broadcasting staff to inform us of students who may have an interest in broadcasting.

Thunderbolt Broadcasting provided three scholarships to Obion County, TN high school students in cooperation with the Tennessee Department of Transportation Litter Grant program and the Obion County Solid Waste Department for seniors enrolled in Union City, Obion County and South Fulton, TN schools. These students have opportunities to learn about broadcasting careers with our company. Students were required to submit essays focusing on keeping our community "clean and green" and how they implemented recycling at home. Students were presented their awards at their schools. Thunderbolt Broadcasting partnered with Don Sol Mexican Grill in Union City, TN. with their "Salsa and Chips for Scholarships." Thunderbolt Radio donated \$100.00 and by doing so were able to help Don Sol raise money for one student from each of the five local high schools to receive a \$500.00 scholarship.

Thunderbolt President Paul Tinkle is the play-by-play announcer of high school sports in Weakley County athletics and stays in contact with local high school principals and other administrators maintaining a "unique" contact for the radio stations for potential employees and prospective interns while at the same time introducing students in the schools about careers in broadcasting. Local educators remind students whom to contact at Thunderbolt radio stations for potential career in broadcasting. High school students from Weakley County, Obion County and South Fulton schools all spent time in our studios learning about broadcasting during the reporting period.

Thunderbolt Broadcasting is a member of the National Association of Broadcasters, the Tennessee Association of Broadcasters, the Kentucky Broadcasters Association and the International Broadcaster's Idea Bank. Thunderbolt Broadcasting is a participant in career fairs as evidenced by documentation elsewhere.

It is apparent Thunderbolt stations are meeting the EEO requirements as set forth in guidelines and continue to open its doors for tours of our radio stations that include but are not limited to church groups, youth, leadership groups, school groups, Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, public and private schools and others as well as community leaders who are able to see first-hand our continuing efforts to share opportunities with those who might have an interest in becoming a part of Thunderbolt Broadcasting. Company employees maintain healthy relationships with our listeners by attending functions and events as evidenced elsewhere where they are able to network with prospective job seekers or those who may wish to know more about a career in broadcasting.

Hosted by the school each year to educate students in their academic and career development. Mr. Tinkle and Mrs. Prince explained to the students the various job opportunities in the radio industry including sales, on air, engineering and digital. Approximately 30 students participated in a recorded interview with Mr. Tinkle that will be played on the radio. As students visited our table, we interacted with them and explained what radio stations do for community and offered extended invitations to students to come visit us.
