Living in the Dash

Theme: Leaving a Legacy That Matters

Scripture:

"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

- Matthew 5:16 (NIV)

"The memory of the righteous is a blessing."

— Proverbs 10:7 (ESV)

One day, your dash will be complete. The dates will be etched in stone. But what you do *between* those dates—the choices you make, the love you give, the impact you leave—that's your legacy.

The truth is, we all leave something behind. Some leave behind bitterness, busyness, or regret. Others leave behind laughter, faith, wisdom, and love. The difference is found not in how long we live, but in how intentionally we live.
