

LOVE OUT LOUD

Day Seven – Love Beyond Differences

Scripture: “‘Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.’ This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.” — Matthew 22:37–40

One of the hardest parts of life is realizing not everyone will see things the way we do. Different backgrounds, different opinions, different beliefs — they can all lead to tension, arguments, or even broken relationships. In today’s world, it often feels like we’re pressured to either agree on everything or cut each other off completely. But God calls us to a different way: *loving out loud, even when we disagree.*

Agreeing to disagree doesn’t mean watering down your faith or stepping away from God’s truth. It means standing firm on His Word while still showing grace, patience, and respect to others. We may not see eye-to-eye on politics, culture, or personal choices, but under God’s commandments, one thing is non-negotiable: *we are called to love.*

Jesus didn’t say, “*Love your neighbor if they vote like you, look like you, or worship like you.*” He simply said, “*Love your neighbor.*” That means love isn’t tied to sameness — it’s tied to obedience. We can disagree on details but remain united in compassion.

Think of it this way: God created the body with many parts — hands, feet, eyes, ears — all different, but all working together. Diversity

doesn't have to divide us; it can strengthen us if love is the foundation.

It's okay to say, "*I don't agree with you, but I still love you.*" That's not weakness — that's strength. Loving out loud means valuing people more than arguments, keeping relationships above pride, and remembering that love is always the louder witness of Christ than debate.

Ways to Love Out Loud Today:

- Choose not to argue over differences — listen instead.
- Find common ground with someone who sees things differently.
- Pray for unity in your community, church, and family.
- Remember: the goal is not to win arguments, but to win hearts through love.
