DAY 2 — Thankful for a New Day

Verse: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." — Psalm 118:24

There's something beautiful about mornings... even the messy ones. Some mornings feel like a Hallmark movie — sun shining through the blinds, coffee brewing just right, birds singing like they're on your payroll. And then there are the *other* mornings — the ones where your alarm doesn't go off, the dog makes a mess, you can't find your keys, and you're running late before you even get your shoes on.

But here's the thing:

No matter what your morning looks like...

the moment your eyes open, God hands you a brand-new day.

A clean slate.

A reset button.

This is a new day. A God-made day.

And if God made it, it's worth walking into with gratitude.

Lord, thank You for giving us this new day — a gift we don't deserve but desperately need.
