Verse: "For no matter how many promises God has made, they are 'Yes' in Christ." — 2 Corinthians 1:20

And every unfulfilled promise is proof that God is not finished yet.

So today, be thankful not only for the promises you've seen come to pass, but also for the ones you're still waiting on.

Because if God promised it, He will do it — in His time and in His way.

Lord, today we thank You for Your promises — promises that are unchanging, unbreakable, and rooted in Your faithfulness.

Thank You for every promise You've already fulfilled and every promise You are still working on.

For those listening who are waiting, trusting, and praying for answers, strengthen their faith today.
