

Day Seven — Loved Through Waiting

Scripture *“But those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength.”*
— Isaiah 40:31 (NIV)

Waiting is one of the hardest places to trust love. When answers are delayed and prayers seem unanswered, it’s easy to wonder whether God still sees us or cares deeply about what we’re facing.

But waiting is not a sign of abandonment—it is often a season of shaping.

God’s love does not pause while we wait. He is present in the silence, working in ways we cannot yet see. Waiting teaches us to depend on God rather than outcomes, to trust His heart rather than His timing.

Loved through waiting means believing that God’s love remains constant even when progress feels slow. It’s learning to rest in the truth that delays do not diminish God’s care.

Real-Life Scenarios

- **You're waiting for healing**, but the progress is slower than expected. God's love meets you daily with strength, patience, and presence.
- **You're waiting for clarity about a decision**, feeling unsure which direction to take. God's love reassures you that He will guide you step by step.
- **You're waiting for a relationship to change or begin**, and loneliness settles in. God's love reminds you that you are never unseen or forgotten.
- **You're waiting for doors to open professionally**, wondering if your efforts matter. God's love affirms that your worth is not tied to outcomes.
- **You're waiting for peace after loss or disappointment**, and healing feels distant. God's love holds you steady while restoration unfolds.

Each waiting season becomes an opportunity to experience God's love more deeply—not because the waiting is easy, but because God is faithful.

- Where am I currently waiting on God?
- How might this season be shaping my faith?

Choose one area of waiting today and surrender it to God—trusting Him with both the timing and the outcome.
