

Speaker Pat Grassley Files for Re-Election to Iowa House

(Des Moines, IA) – On Wednesday, March 11th, Speaker Pat Grassley (R-New Hartford) filed for re-election to the Iowa House. Grassley is running for House District 57, which contains all of Butler County and a western portion of Bremer County.

"Throughout my journey in the Iowa House, the support from my district has meant so much to me," Grassley said. "We've stood firm for Iowans' freedoms, reduced the tax burden, and brought common sense back to our state policies and institutions. But there's more work to do.
