For the Western Carolinas and Northeast Georgia

5 AM Saturday January 11th, 2025

Key Messages

- Winter Storm Warning extended for a portion of the NC mountains through noon Saturday.
- NW flow snow continues along the TN/NC border through Saturday morning.

Through Early Saturday Morning




- This graphic includes additional totals for snow.
- NW flow snow expected to continue along the TN/NC border through noon today.
- An additional 1-3 inches likely, with larger amounts at higher elevations.



Peak Wind Gusts

Saturday Morning into Saturday Night



- Winds become breezy across the higher elevations of the North Carolina mountains. 30-40 mph possible at the peaks.
- Gusty winds develop behind the departing winter storm early Saturday morning before gradually diminishing into Saturday night.

- Northwest flow snow showers linger along the NC/TN border through early Saturday afternoon.
- Temperatures drop into the teens to lower 20s and teens Saturday night, leading to a black ice threat on untreated roads through Sunday morning.
- The black ice threat may linger through Sunday night, especially for areas that remain below freezing and for any areas confined to shade during the day.






