


# Winter and Extreme Cold Weather Briefing #3

For the Western Carolinas and Northeast Georgia

## Valid: 5:30 PM EST Sunday, January 19th, 2025

### What's Changed

- The Cold Weather Advisory for tonight was expanded to include Alexander County in the North Carolina foothills.
- All other products (ongoing winter storm warning/advisory and extreme cold warning) remain unchanged.
- Light snow possible late Tuesday afternoon into early Wednesday morning, mainly south of I-85.





## **Additional Snowfall Totals**

**Thru Early Monday Morning** 

Ongoing snow will continue this evening and into tonight before gradually tapering off by sunrise Monday morning

### Impacts:

- Untreated roadways may become very slippery and treacherous as dry snow accumulates on very cold surfaces.
- Some roads may become impassable.
- Power outages are possible where the heaviest snow accumulates.






## **Extreme Cold Warning and Cold Weather Advisory**

January 19, 2025 5:02 PM

**Late Tonight through Monday Morning** 

## **Dangerous Cold Expected**

- Above 3500 ft: wind chills as low as -20°F
- Below 3500 ft: wind chills from the single digits to -10°F
- Outside of the mountains: single digits






### **Peak Wind Gusts**

### **Through Monday Morning**

- Gusty winds will continue across the area with gusts of 25 to 35 mph likely through Monday morning.
- Wind gusts of 30 to 45 mph are possible across the higher elevations of the NC mountains and NE GA.
- Wind gusts are not expected to be high enough to warrant a Wind Advisory at this time.









## Minimum Wind Chills



## **Light Snow Possible**

#### Late Tuesday Afternoon into Early Wednesday Morning



- Light snow will be possible, mainly south of I-85, late Tuesday afternoon into early Wednesday morning.
- Snow probabilities have decreased and only light accumulations, if any, are expected.
- Regardless, even light snow could result in slick spots on roads given very cold temperatures.




# Light Snow Possible Tue Afternoon into Early Wed

## **Summary of Greatest Impacts**

For the Western Carolinas and Northeast Georgia

- A <u>Winter Storm Warning</u> is in effect until 7 AM Monday for Haywood, Madison, Yancey, Mitchell, and Avery counties, as well as Graham and Swain counties above 3500 ft.
- A <u>Winter Weather Advisory</u> is in effect until 7 AM Monday for northern Jackson County, as well as Graham and Swain counties below 3500 ft and Buncombe County above 3500 ft.
- An Extreme Cold Warning is in effect from late tonight thru Monday morning for elevations above 3500 ft across the NC mountains. Wind chills are expected to drop into the -5°F to -20°F range.
- A <u>Cold Wx Advisory</u> is in effect from late tonight thru Monday morning for elevations below 3500 ft across the NC mountains, the NC foothills, the SC mountains, and far NE Georgia. Wind chills are expected to drop into the single digits to as cold as -10°F.
- Refer to the "Cold Wave" Special Weather Statement (SPS) for important calls-to-action.
- Very cold temperatures and wind chills are likely to continue into mid-week, with a gradual warming expected by late next week.
- There is a possibility of light snow late Tuesday afternoon into early Wednesday morning, mainly along and south of I-85. The likelihood of accumulations >1" is currently low (25%, or less).








