

## Winter Weather Today through Early Thursday

**Decision Support Briefing 9 for the western Carolinas and northeast Georgia** 


# NEW

### **Important Updates**

- Overall, snow accumulations have trended down, especially across the NC Piedmont.
- → Little to no ice accumulations expected, so have removed the Storm Total Ice graphic.

### **Key Messages**

- Low pressure moving south of the area will spread precipitation across the region this morning with marginally cold air in place, producing light snow accumulations, mainly in the mountains.
- Snow spreads east into the NC Piedmont this afternoon, with light accumulations possible, mainly in the northern Piedmont.
- A break in precipitation may occur across most of the area this evening, with another round of mainly snow showers possible Thursday morning across the Advisory area.





## **Possible Snow Amounts**

**Wednesday Morning thru Thursday Morning** 

#### **Hazard Details**

- Slight downward adjustments in precipitation amounts from previous forecast.
- Confidence is highest for mostly snow across the mountains, northern foothills, and northwest Piedmont. Sleet is expected to mix in across the southern foothills and Charlotte metro area. A rain/snow mix is expected across the northern Upstate and extreme northeast GA.
- The wintry precipitation is now expected to taper off this evening; however, light snow showers are expected to redevelop and track across the Piedmont early Thursday morning, with snow accumulations less than one inch.
- Snow showers will likely continue off and on along the NC/TN border region tonight through Thursday afternoon.
