Key Messages

- If you had uninsured losses from Tropical Storm Helene, don't wait. The deadline to apply for Individual Assistance is April 7.
- If FEMA initially says you are not approved for assistance, you might just need to provide more information. Visit a Disaster Recovery Center or call 800-621-3362 to get help appealing the determination. To learn more, visit www.fema.gov/assistance/individual/after-applying/appeals.
- Need help with a FEMA application or appeal? Eleven Disaster Recovery Centers offer face to face help for disaster survivors. To find your nearest center visit <u>fema.gov/drc</u>.

Update

- \$404.5 million approved for 157,567 households, including money for rent, basic home repairs and other disaster-caused needs.
- **\$411 million** in Public Assistance funding approved to support community recovery.
- \$155.1 million disbursed by the U.S. Small Business Administration in low-interest disaster loans.
- 13,304 households have stayed in FEMA-paid hotel rooms (Transitional Sheltering Assistance).
 - o As of March 17, **484** households remain.
- 202 households are currently living in FEMA temporary housing units.
- 3,914 households have received rental assistance.
- 6,534 families have received \$19.4 million for repair or replacement of private-access roads and bridges.
- **5.4 million** cubic yards of debris has been cleared from public rights of ways, **4 million** by state contractors and **1.4 million** by federal contractors.
- The waterway debris mission has removed 1 million cubic yards of debris: approximately 976,000 by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and 70,000 by state contractors.
- \$52.8 million in disaster unemployment benefits have been provided to applicants.
- \$166.6 million paid in claims by the National Flood Insurance Program.
