## **North Carolina Helene Recovery**

## **Key Messages**

- Today, April 7, is the last day for North Carolinians with uninsured damage or loss from Tropical Storm Helene to apply for FEMA financial assistance.
- Keep your contact information current and check on your application status:

  - o Or contact the FEMA Helpline at 800-621-3362
- If you received rental assistance from FEMA and have a continuing need, you can apply for additional FEMA help. Call the FEMA Helpline at 800-621-3362 for information about applying for continued rental assistance.
- If FEMA initially says you are not approved for financial help, you might need to provide more information. Call 800-621-3362 to get help appealing the determination.

## **Update**

- \$422.3 million approved for more than 158,600 households, including money for rent, basic home repairs and other disaster-caused needs.
- **\$439.3 million** in Public Assistance funding obligated to the state to support community recovery.
- \$172 million disbursed by the U.S. Small Business Administration in low-interest disaster loans.
- 13,310 households have stayed in FEMA-paid hotel rooms (Transitional Sheltering Assistance).
  - o As of April 7, **194** households remained.
- 213 households are currently living in FEMA temporary housing units.
- 5.018 households have received rental assistance.
- 7,071 families have received \$20.5 million for repair or replacement of private-access roads and bridges.
- **6.3 million** cubic yards of debris has been cleared from public rights of ways, nearly **4.7 million** by state contractors and more than **1.6 million** by federal contractors.
- The waterway debris mission has removed 2.1 million cubic yards of debris: approximately 1.9 million by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and 125,797 cubic yards by state contractors.
- \$179.3 million paid in claims by the National Flood Insurance Program.
