


Severe Storms Possible Today and Saturday

For the Western Carolinas and Northeast Georgia

OVERVIEW

Severe storms are possible this afternoon and evening (level 1 of 5 threat) and again on Saturday (level 2 of 5 threat). See slide 2 for Saturday's Severe risk.



TIMING

During the afternoon and evening hours each day.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

 Damaging wind gusts are the primary threat with any severe storms that develop each day.

NWS ALERTS

None at this time.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

• A line of storms will track across the area this evening into tonight but is expected to weaken as it pushes across the mountains (area circled in red). Thus, confidence on the severe weather threat outside the southwest North Carolina mountains remains very low.

POST-EVENT OUTLOOK

• The pattern remains unsettled through next week. A few strong to severe storms are possible each afternoon and evening, although there will be a brief lull in activity Monday.



Severe Storm Risk for Saturday

For the Western Carolinas and Northeast Georgia



Confidence on the severe weather threat for Saturday has decreased.

A few strong to severe storms are possible Saturday afternoon and evening but confidence is low.

Another line of storms will approach the forecast area Saturday evening into Saturday night but once again a weakening trend is likely as activity pushes east so confidence remains low.
