


Severe Storms & Localized Flooding Possible Today

July 9, 2025 5:42 AM

For the western Carolinas and northeast Georgia

OVERVIEW

- Strong to severe thunderstorms will be possible this afternoon and evening.
- Excessive rainfall from some of these storms could produce localized flooding (see slide 2 for flooding threat).



 Storms are expected to develop over the NC mountains this afternoon and then spread eastward and southward.

Some storms could linger thru the late evening hours, especially over our eastern zones.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

TIMING

• Damaging wind gusts are the main hazard with any severe storms that develop. Isolated large hail cannot be ruled out.

• In addition, storms will be capable of producing heavy downpours that may lead to localized flash flooding, especially over areas that receive multiple rounds of rain.

NWS ALERTS

None at this time.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The active pattern will continue thru the end of the week, with strong to severe thunderstorms and localized flooding possible each day.



- Storm coverage is expected to be greater over western North Carolina this afternoon and evening.
- This will increase the likelihood of excessive rainfall that could produce localized flooding.
