Totals on page 2. **Excessive Rainfall HAZARDS** & Localized and isolated flash flooding could occur in areas that **IMPACTS** have received rain over the past few days, especially on Statesville roadways and near smaller creeks/rivers. Morganton Asheville **NWS ALERTS** None. Waynesville Given the ongoing cold air damming, instability will be difficult Charlotte to increase in this relatively stable environment. If any Gaffney **FORECAST** Monroe instability can develop, this could increase rain rates. This Rock Hill **CHALLENGES** would elevate the flooding risk in areas that have already Union received rain prior to today. Seneca Toccoa Daily rain chances continue through the end of the week as Anderson **POST-EVENT** the pattern remains favorable for continued shower and OUTLOOK thunderstorm activity.
