



# Isolated Flooding Threat Tonight through Tuesday

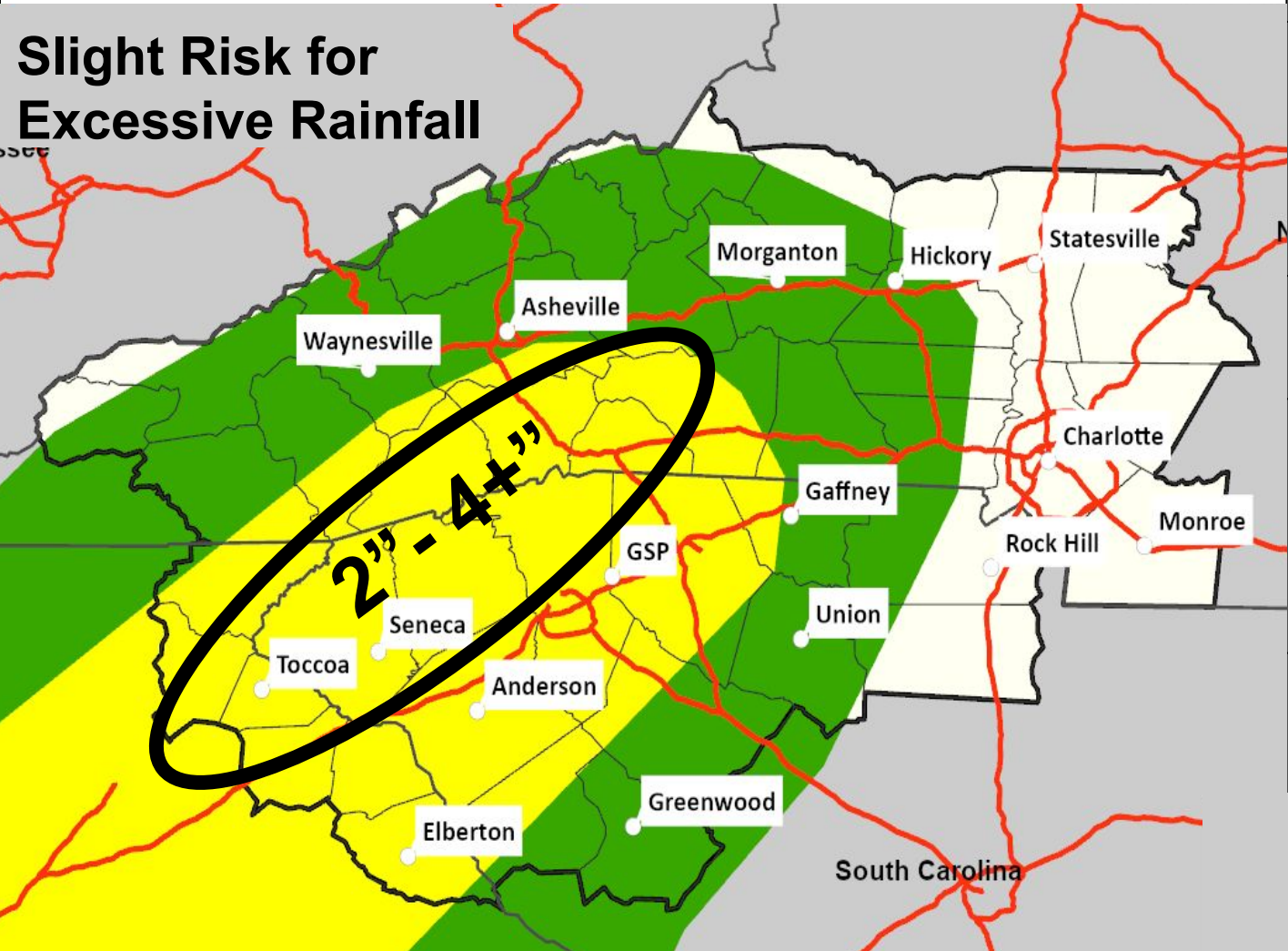

For the Northern Upstate of SC and Southern Escarpment

## OVERVIEW

- A heavy rainfall event is setting up over the Northern Upstate of SC and Northeast GA for tonight and into Tuesday morning. Isolated flash flooding can be expected.

## Slight Risk for Excessive Rainfall



### TIMING

- The heavier rain moves in after midnight and should taper off before 12PM Tuesday.
- The main areas of concern will be in the **Southern Escarpment**, along and north of **HWY 11**. There could also be isolated flooding concerns along and **north of I-85 in NE Georgia and SC/NC (black circle)**.

### HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Rainfall amounts: 2-4" with isolated exceedance of 4" possible in a few locations (**black circle**). Totals on page 2.
- Localized and isolated flash flooding could occur in areas that have received rain over the past few days, especially on roadways and near smaller creeks/rivers.

### NWS ALERTS

- None.

### FORECAST CHALLENGES

- Given the ongoing cold air damming, instability will be difficult to increase in this relatively stable environment. If any instability can develop, this could increase rain rates. This would elevate the flooding risk in areas that have already received rain prior to today.

### POST-EVENT OUTLOOK

- Daily rain chances continue through the end of the week as the pattern remains favorable for continued shower and thunderstorm activity.

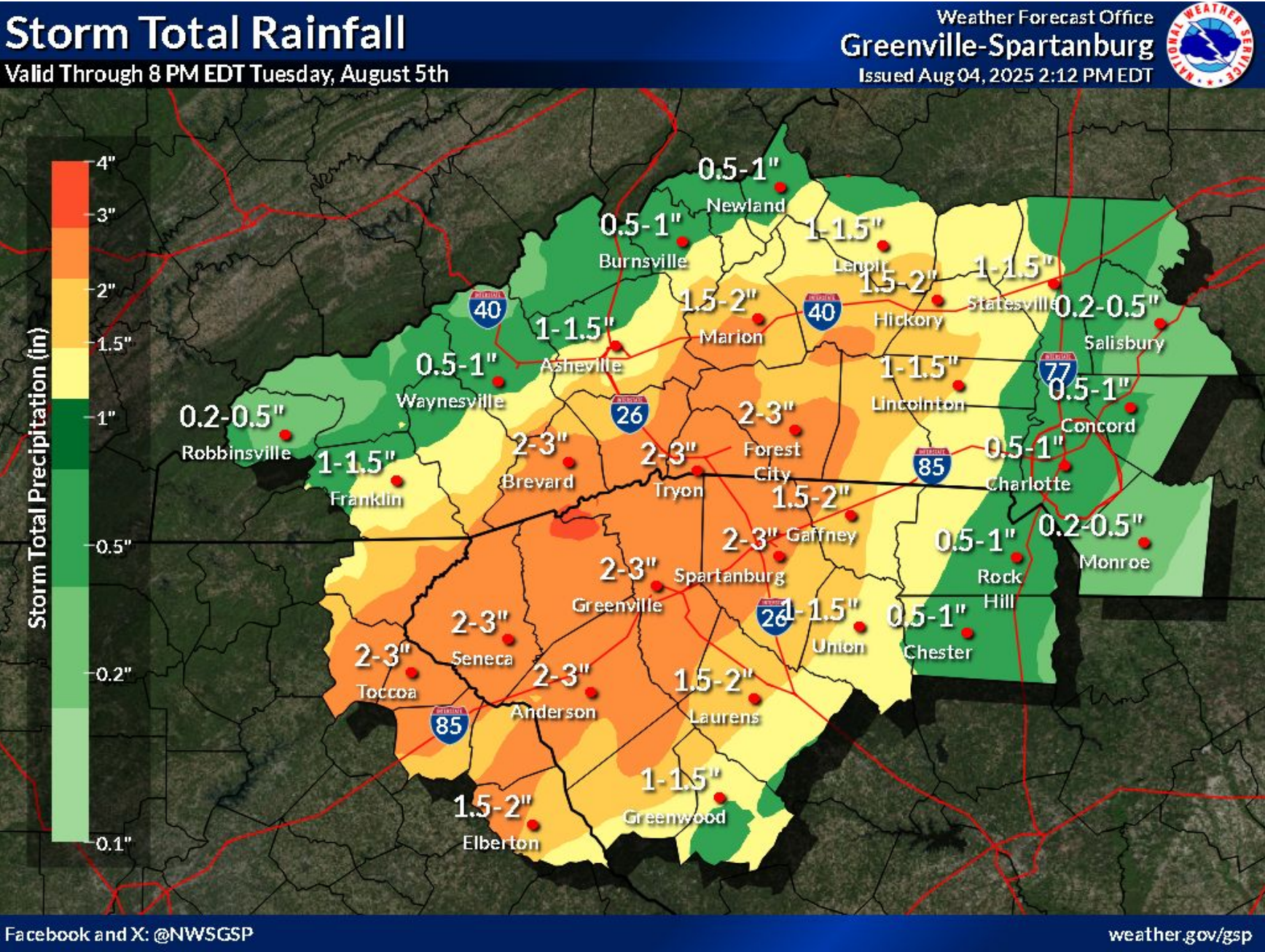




# Rainfall Totals
