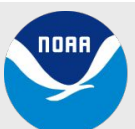
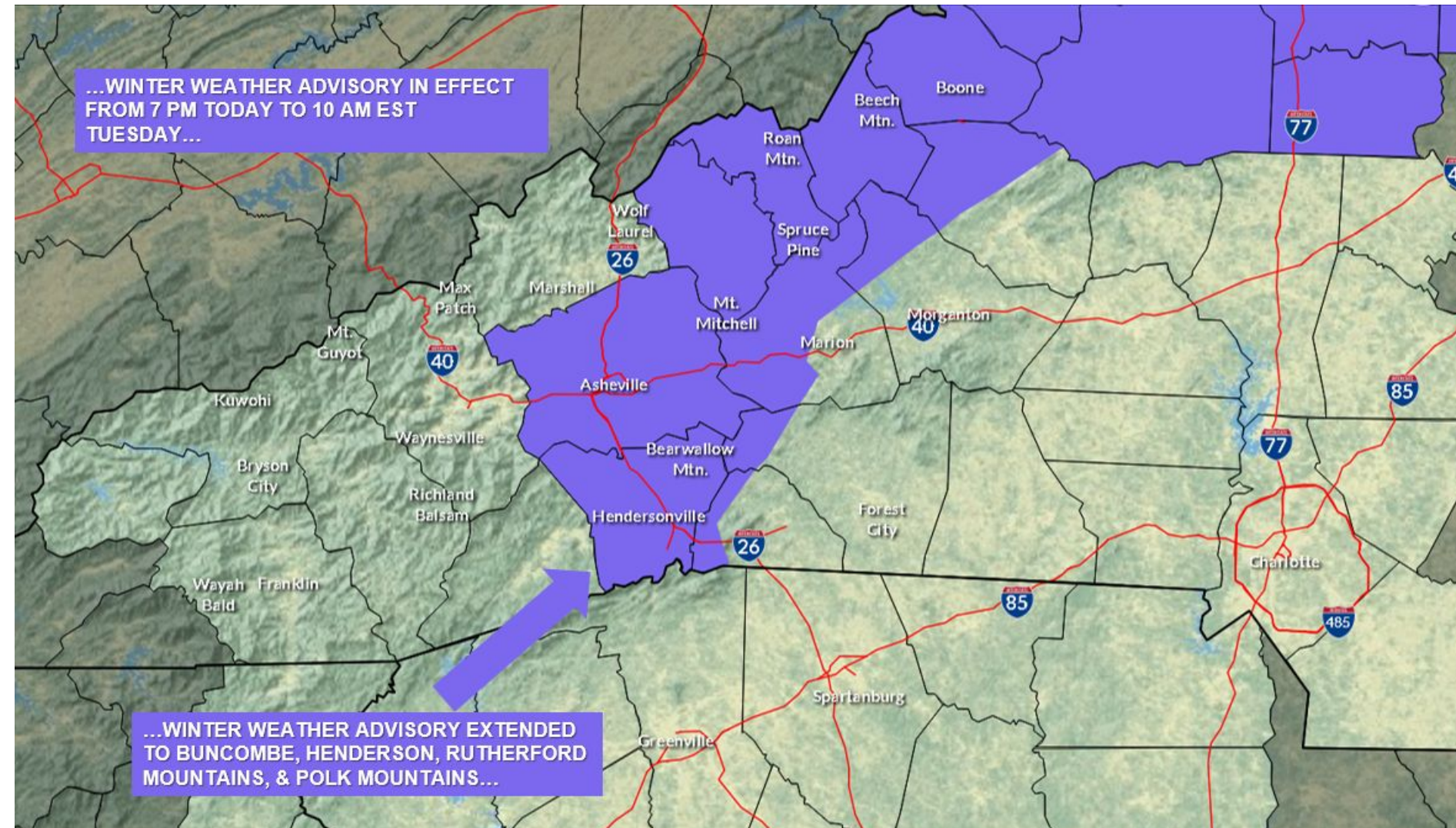

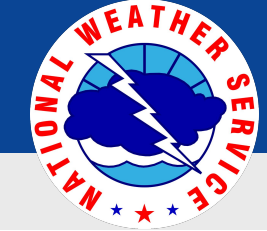
Important Updates

- Winter Weather Advisory extended into Buncombe, Henderson, Rutherford Mountains, and Polk Mountains.
- Winter Weather Advisory remains in effect from 7 PM Today to 10 AM EST Tuesday for all counties/zones highlighted in the graphic to the right.

Key Messages

- Another wintry precipitation event will occur tonight into early Tuesday morning across the northern mountains and adjacent foothills of North Carolina.





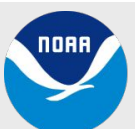
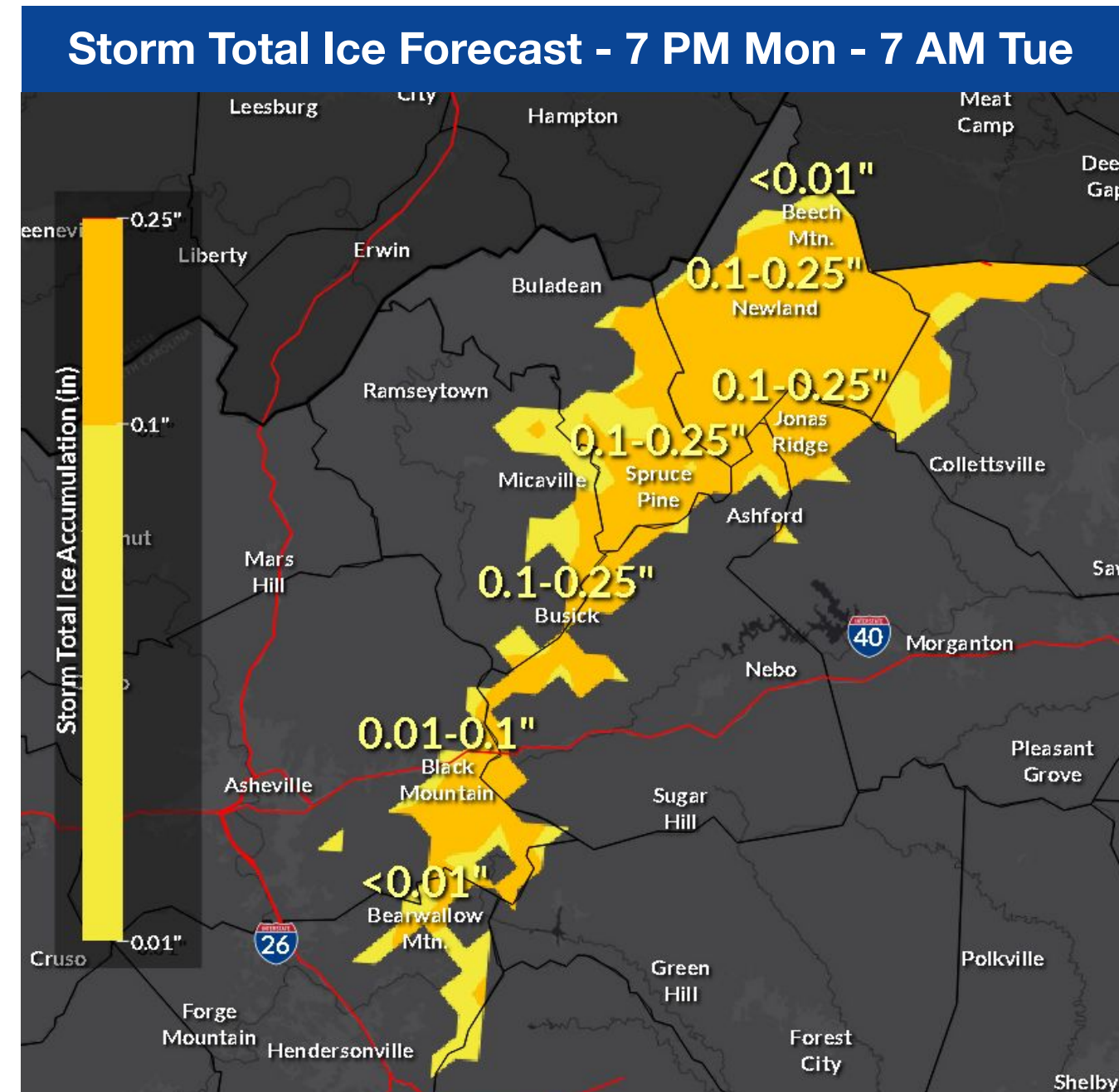
Forecast Ice Totals

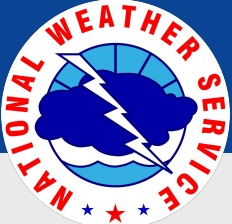

Northern Mountains/Foothills - North Carolina

Details

- Most areas outside the northern mountains and adjacent foothills of North Carolina should see all rain for the duration of the event, aside from some sleet possibly mixing in at the onset of precipitation tonight (but with no accumulation).
- Freezing rain is the most likely precipitation type wherever temperatures are below freezing. However, sleet and/or snow may mix in at times.
- **NOTE:** Ice accumulations will stay confined to the eastern-most portions of Buncombe and Henderson Counties. Mostly east of a line roughly from Swannanoa to Fairview and Edneyville
 - Little to no accumulation expected in Asheville, Hendersonville, and west of the I-26 corridor.

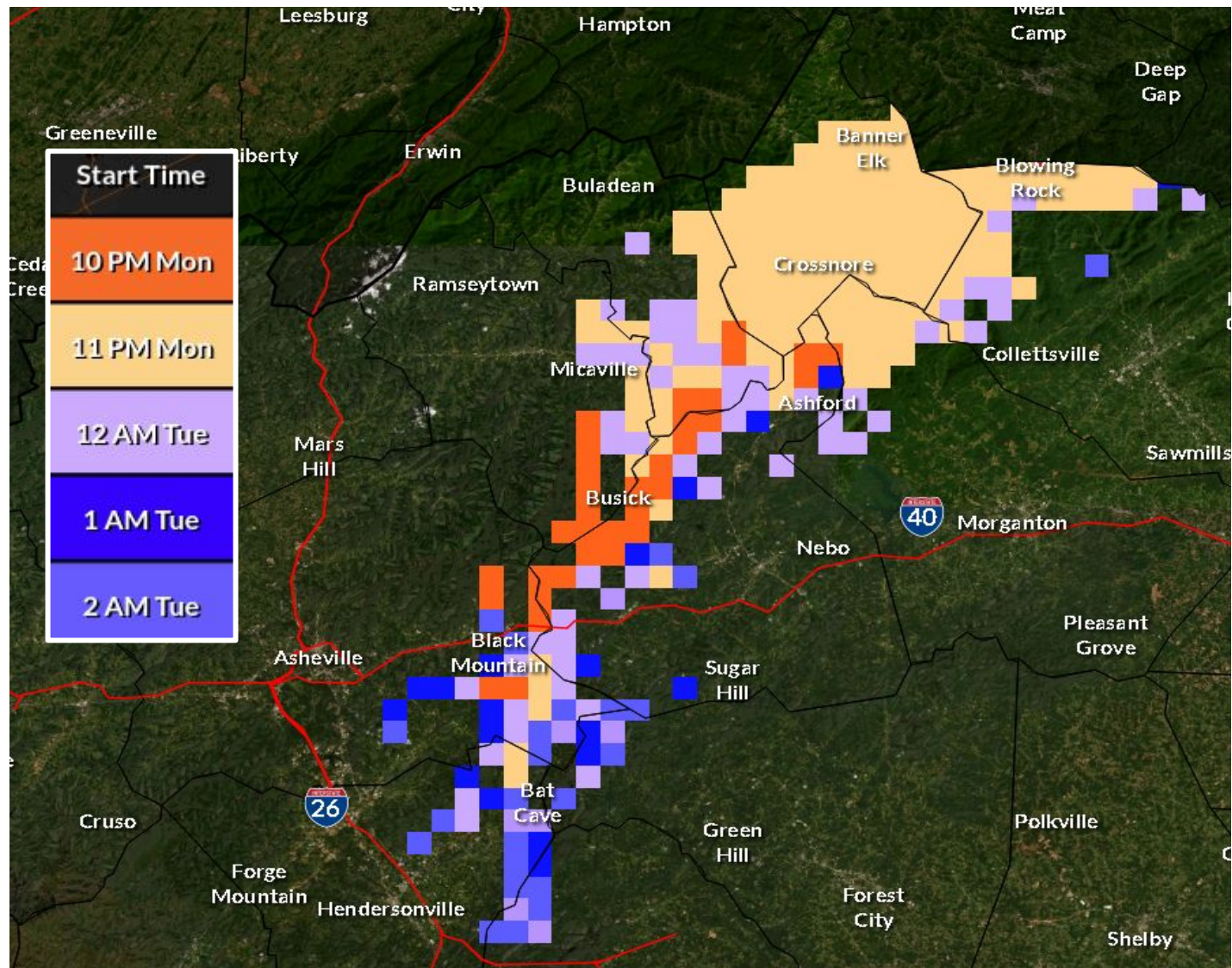




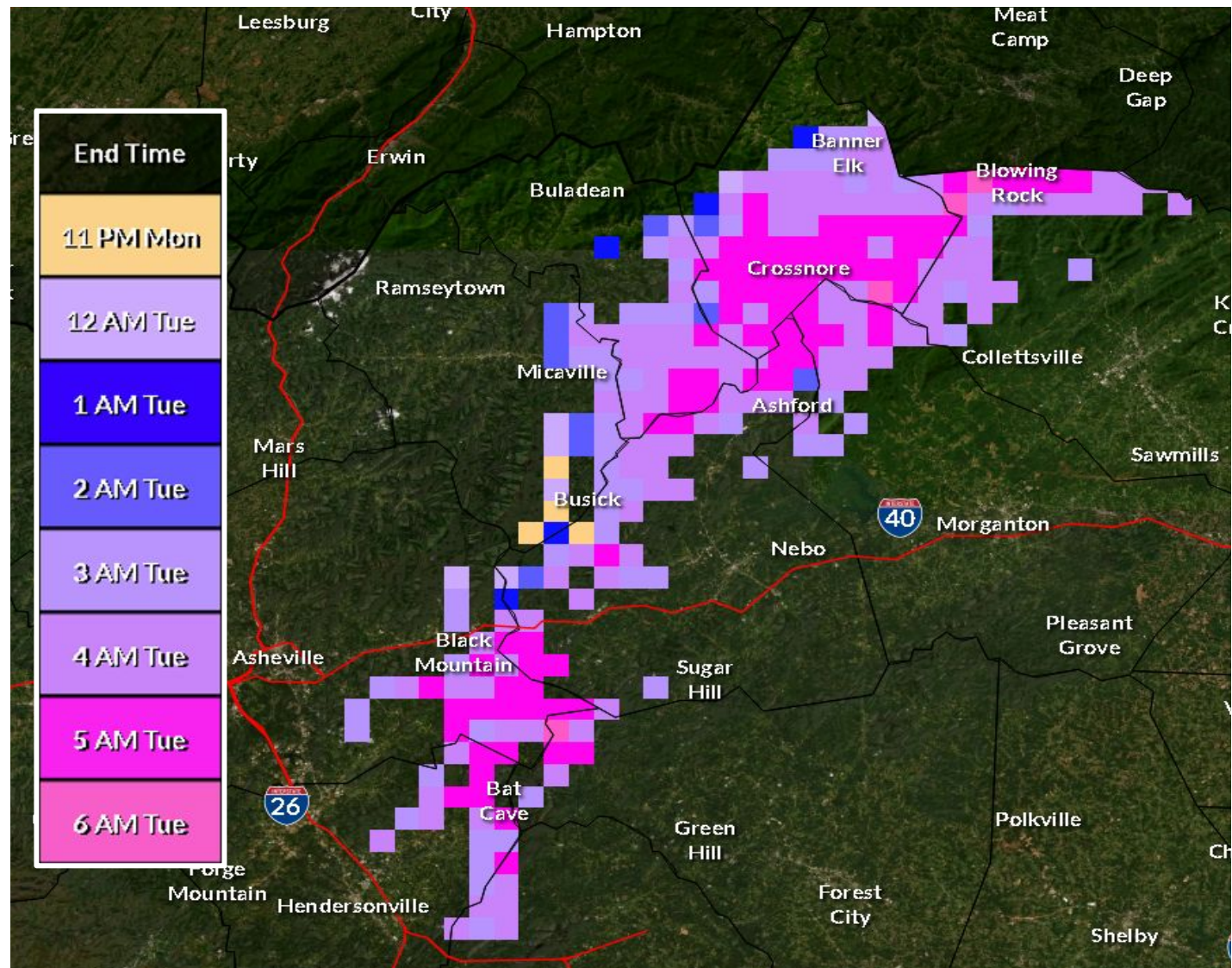
Precipitation Type Timing

December 1, 2025
2:15 PM

For Selected North Carolina Mountain/Foothill Locations



START TIME: Precipitation develops after 7 PM this evening and will spread generally southwest to northeast across the area through early morning. The most likely time ice will begin to accumulate is shown above.



END TIME: Freezing rain should end as temperatures warm toward daybreak, changing over to rain in all areas by 5-6 AM. Once it is clear road conditions are no longer being impacted, the Advisory could be cancelled early.
