

Winter Weather Briefing for Tonight/Friday


Decision Support Briefing #3 for the Western Carolinas and Northeast Georgia



→ Updated snow/ice totals

Key Messages

- → Precipitation will start after 8 PM, as a wintry mix in portions of the mountains, and otherwise as a cold rain. Falling temperatures overnight will allow accumulation of ice and snow in the Advisory area, and in portions of the Piedmont along/north of I-40.
- → Precipitation will gradually transition to rain as temperatures warm Friday morning, with the exception of elevations above 3500' in the northern mountains and Blue Ridge Escarpment.




Forecast Snow Totals

Western North Carolina

Details

- Snow/Sleet is most likely across the mountains and along/north of I-40, and light accumulations are expected in these areas. Snow is likely to be wet in character and mixed with sleet.
 - As temperatures warm Friday morning, rain will become the predominant precip type wherever temperatures are above freezing, or freezing rain where temperatures remain below freezing.
 - The Winter Weather Advisory currently ends at 10 AM Friday with most southwestern mountain areas seeing only rain by that time.
 - Advisory ends at 1 PM Friday in the northern mountains due to slower warming there.
 - Precipitation chances decrease after noon Friday.
- Most locations are forecasted to receive less than one inch of snow, but this is subject to change. Locally higher amounts, and expansion of the Winter Weather Advisory, can't be ruled out along/north of I-40.






Western North Carolina

Details

- Snow will begin to mix with sleet and freezing freezing rain between midnight and daybreak Friday across most of the mountains.
- By 11 AM to 1 PM Friday precipitation will have ended, or changed to all rain except for high elevations in the northern mountains where freezing rain could continue later into Friday.
- Remaining chances Friday night are for only rain, and primarily in the GA/SC counties.
- Freezing rain accumulations will be highest in locations where temperatures remain at or below freezing for the longest period of time.
- Accumulations of up to a quarter of an inch can't be ruled out. Expect slippery conditions, especially on untreated roads and isolated to scattered power outages.
