## Important Updates

→ Cold Weather Advisory has been **expanded** to include portions of the NC Piedmont and remains for portions of the NC mountains for frigid wind chill values.

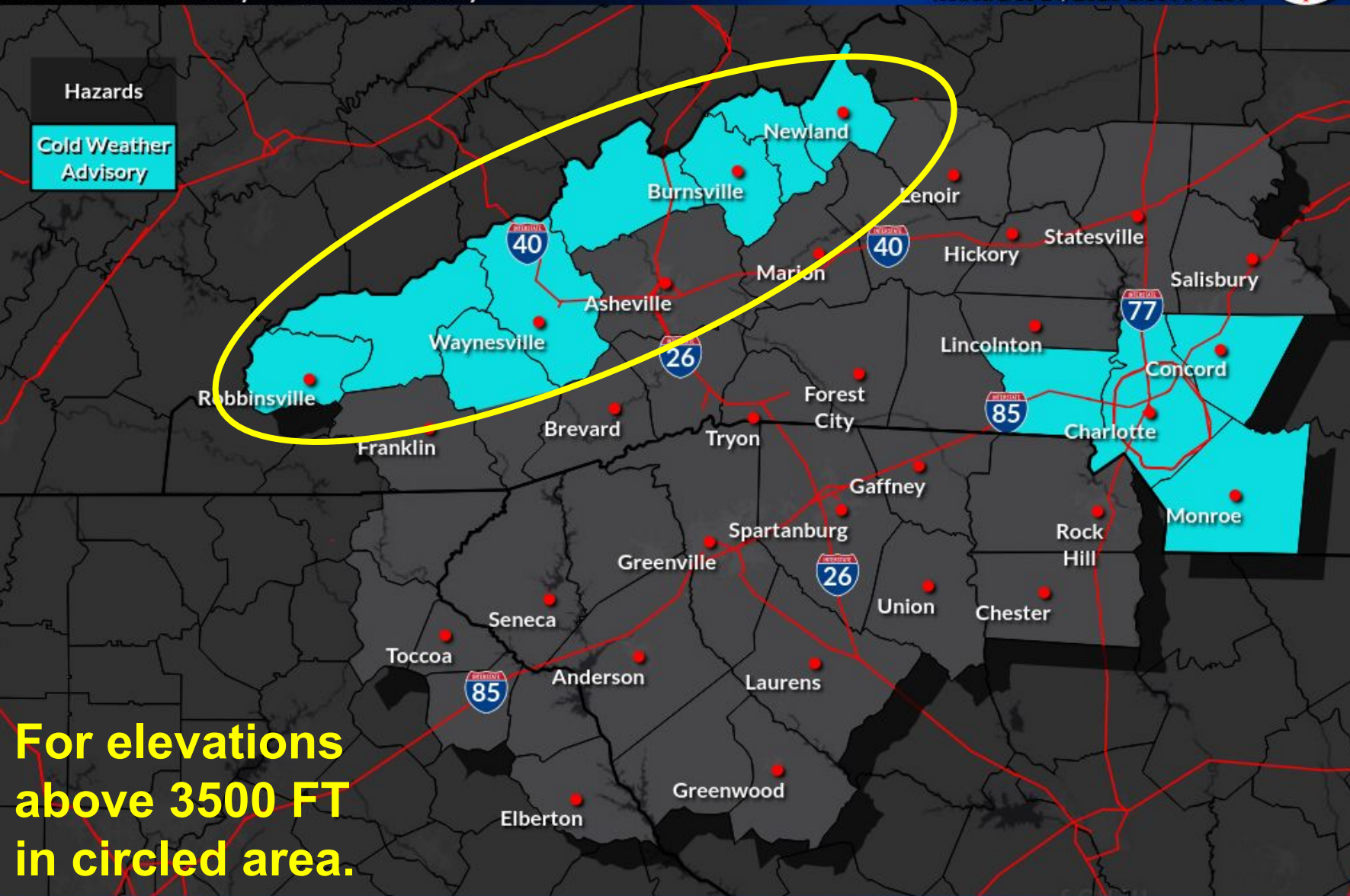
## Key Messages

- An arctic cold front moves into the area overnight, ushering in bitterly cold temperatures and gusty winds through Sunday night.
- Dangerous wind chills expected in the high elevations and portions of the NC Piedmont Sunday through early Monday morning.
- Gusty winds expected across the area with gusts over 45 mph possible above 3500 ft through the day Sunday into Sunday evening.

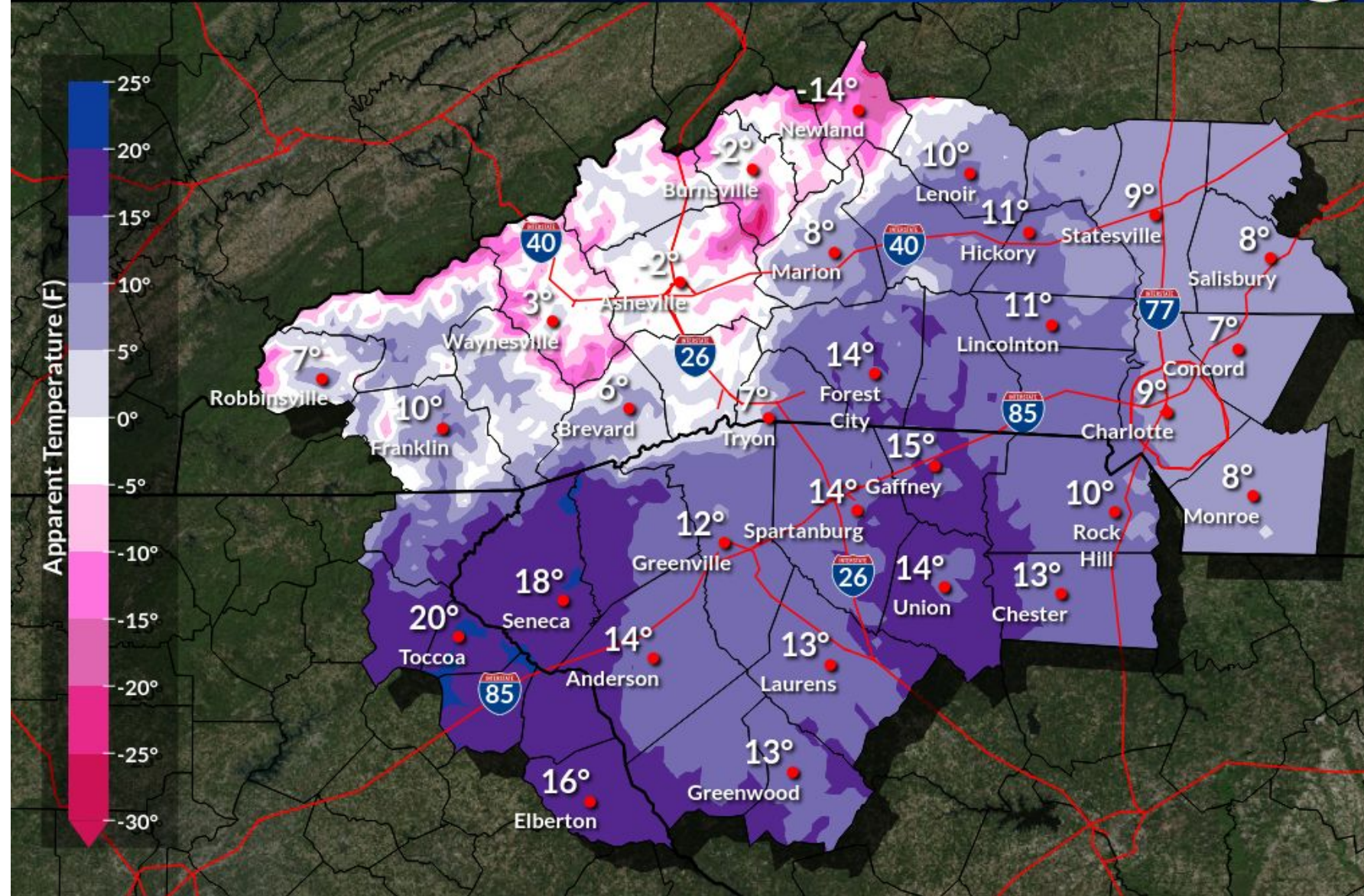
## Hazard Details

- **Cold Weather Advisory** in effect from 5 PM Sunday through 9 AM Monday for wind chills falling in the -5 to -15 degree range in the mountains and single digits for the NC Piedmont.
- The lowest wind chills are expected to be tonight, but remain gradually warm up through Monday morning as the winds diminish.
- Temperatures will remain cold Monday through Monday night, but wind chills are not expected to be as cold Monday night.

## Minimum Wind Chill Through Tonight

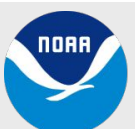

## Hazard Details

- **Gusts of 25 to 45 mph** expected across the mountains starting after sunrise today and lingering through Sunday evening.
- Strongest wind gusts are expected to be this morning across the high peaks and elsewhere throughout the day. Winds will begin to weaken overnight through Monday morning.

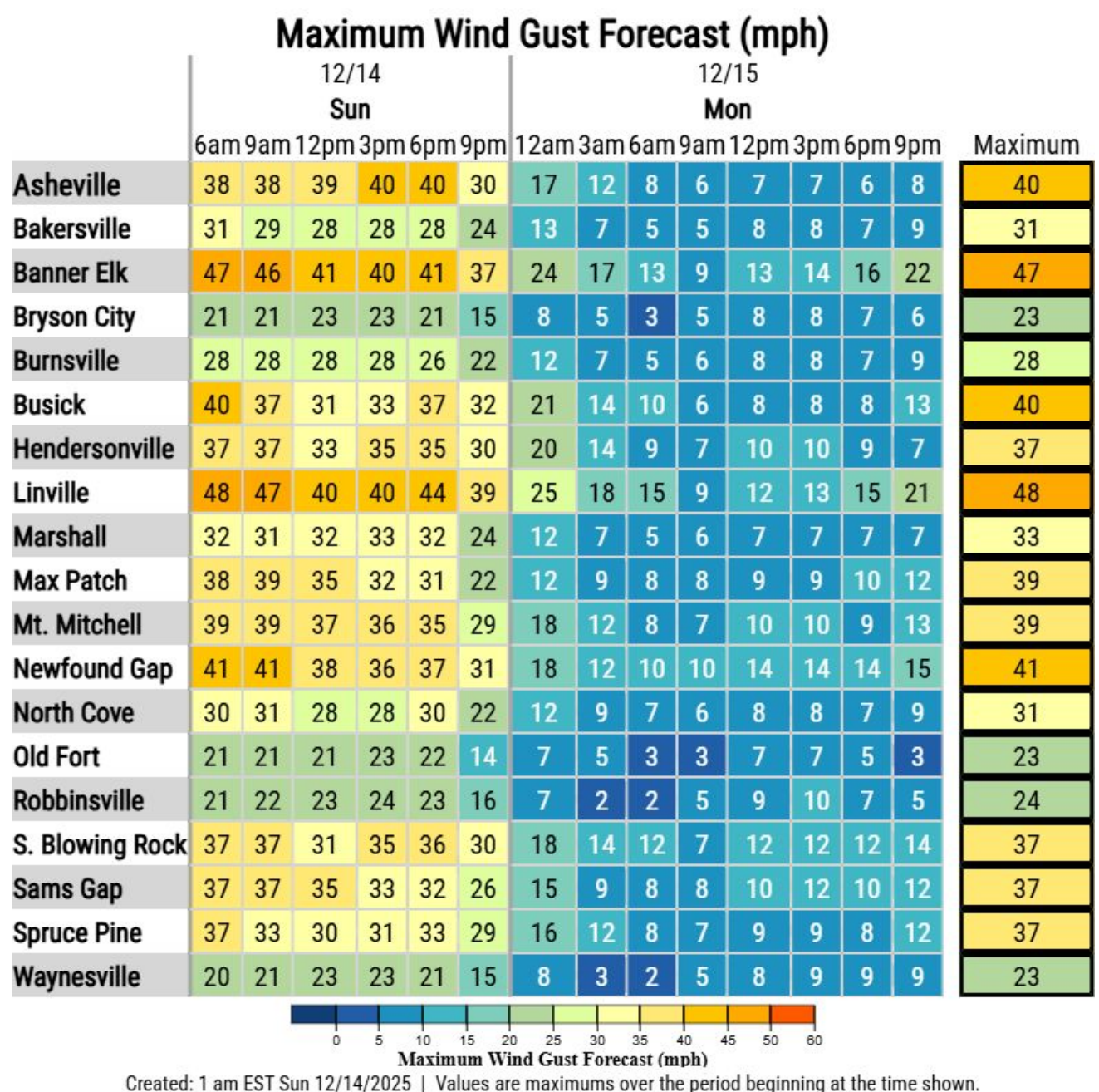
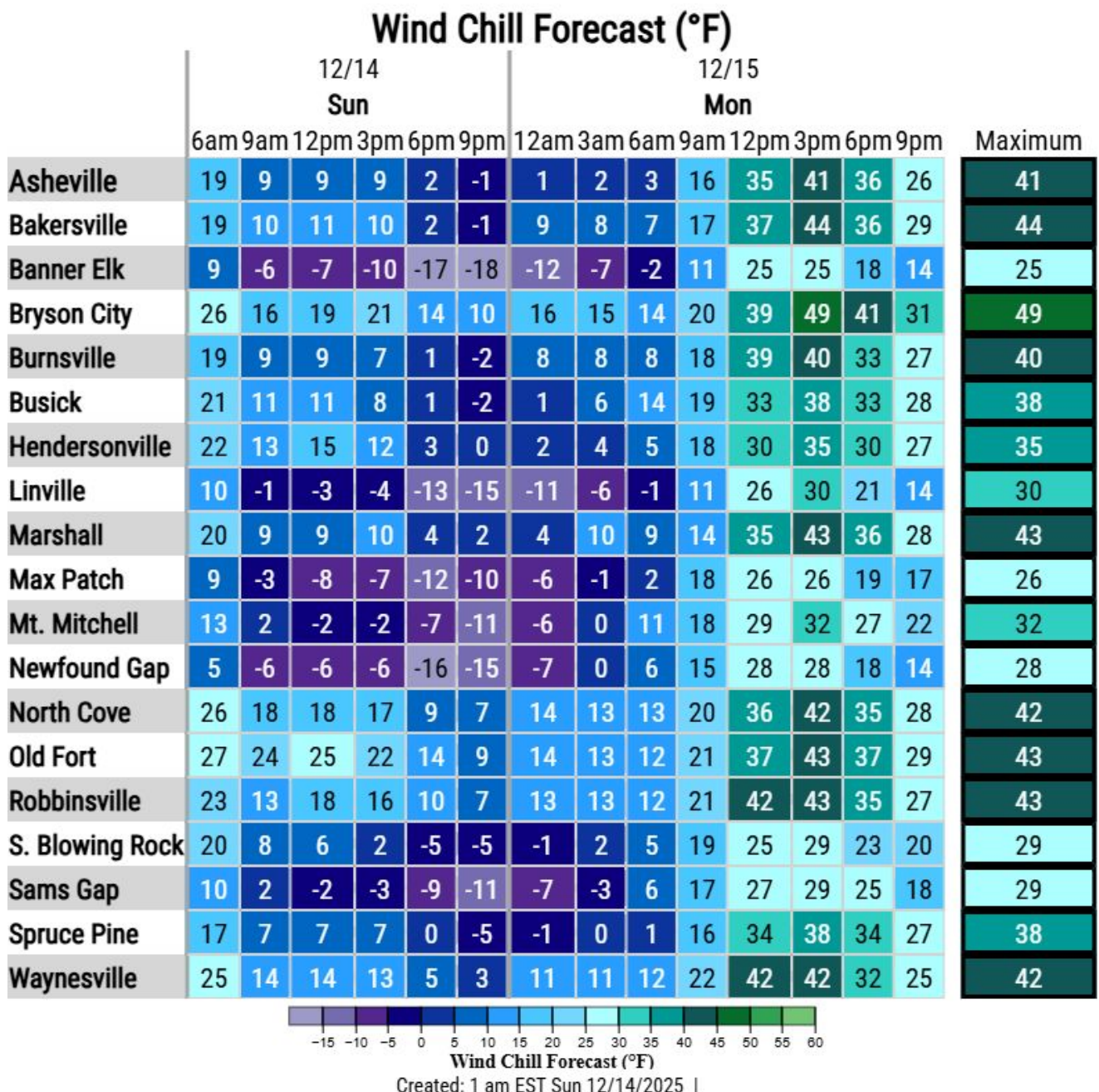
