




Monitoring Another Round of Winter Weather

January 27, 2026
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For the western Carolinas and northeast Georgia

OVERVIEW

- Snow chances continue to gradually increase for this weekend.
- If snow were to fall, impacts to travel can be expected due to the cold temperatures prior to onset.
- Lower confidence on the overall timing, impacts, and snow amounts this far out.



TIMING

- Friday Evening Through Saturday

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- This system favors snow as the cold air will already be in place, with no ice likely.
- Potential for accumulating snowfall exists for parts of the western Carolinas and northeast Georgia, but confidence remains low in regards to specific amounts.
- Highest potential for impactful snowfall currently favors locations along and east of I-77.

FORECAST CHALLENGES

- Trends will change between now and closer to the event.
- Snowfall amounts are **highly uncertain** and will be dependent on where an area of low pressure develops off the Southeast Coast.
- Confidence on specifics likely remain low until Thursday at the earliest.

POST-EVENT OUTLOOK

- Below normal temperatures are likely to continue after this weekend once the winter weather potential ends.
