

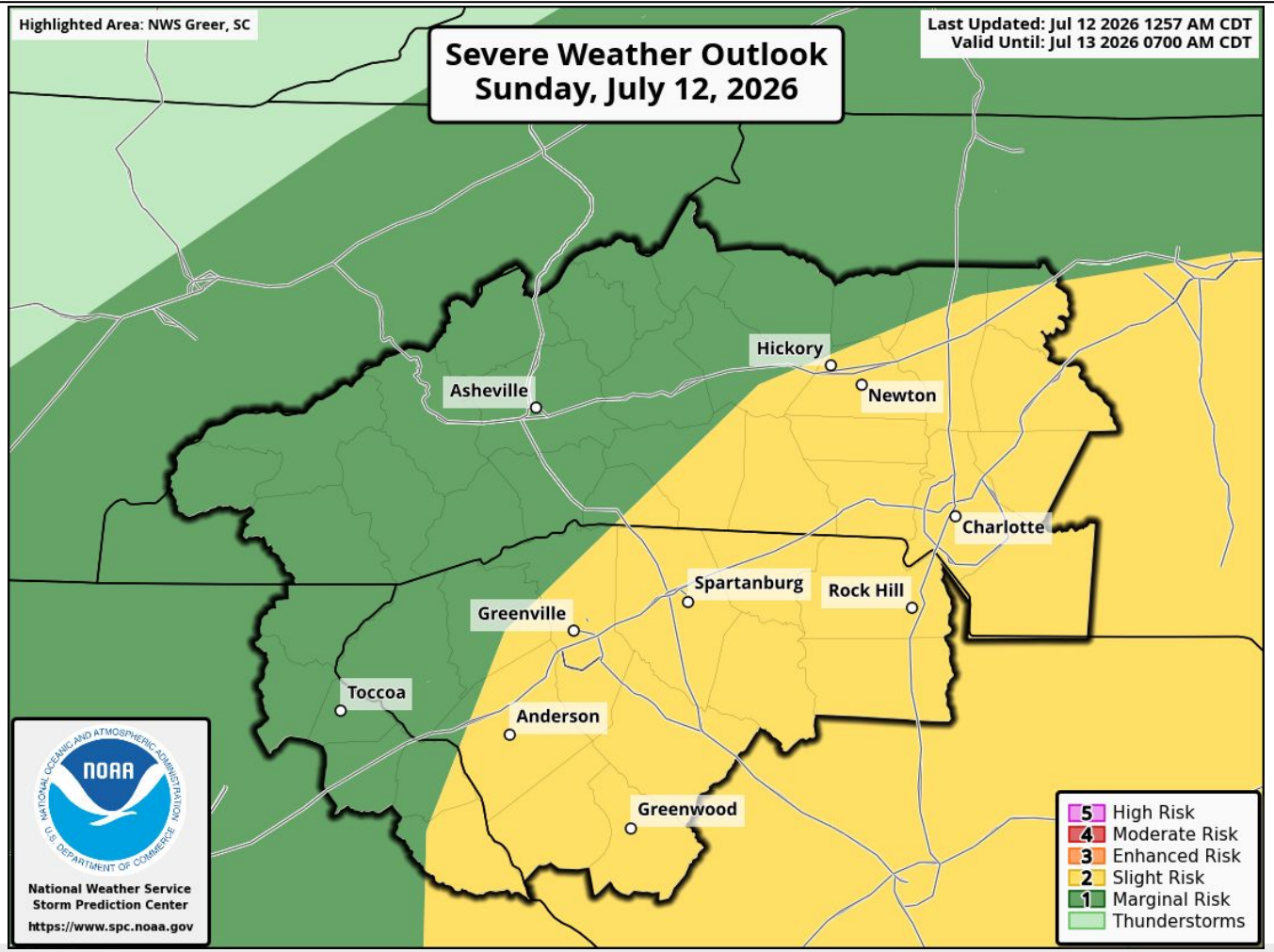
Isolated Severe Storms & Localized Flash Flooding

For the western Carolinas and northeast Georgia

OVERVIEW

- Scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms are expected through tonight, especially this afternoon and evening.
- Isolated severe storms are expected this afternoon and evening, with damaging wind gusts as the primary hazard.
- A localized flash flood threat is also expected to develop this afternoon, continuing through tonight.



TIMING

- Scattered heavy rain showers and isolated thunderstorms will continue this morning, mainly across the mountains.
- Coverage and intensity of showers and storms will increase and expand to cover the entire area early this afternoon.
- Peak severe storm threat: 2 PM to 8 PM EDT.
- Flash flood threat: Mainly from 2 PM through tonight.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Isolated severe thunderstorms may produce **damaging wind gusts** capable of **downing trees and causing scattered power outages**.
- The highest severe weather threat is across **the Piedmont**.
- Localized flash flooding is possible where heavy rain occurs repeatedly or over a short period of time.
- While flash flooding is possible across the entire area, the highest threat will be across the North Carolina mountains, and in locations that have seen very heavy rainfall over the past couple of days.

POST EVENT OUTLOOK

- The potential for isolated flash flooding will continue into Monday, although the threat for severe weather will be lower.

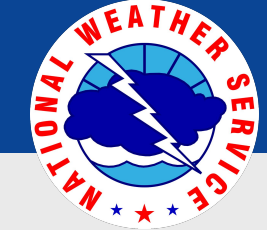
