

VISITOR GUIDELINES

- Patients/Caretakers/Visitors are required to wear a face covering and practice social distancing and proper hand hygiene while inside a CMH facility.
- All patients/caretakers/visitors are being screened at entrances and given a bracelet or sticker that is good for that day only. The bracelet or sticker must be worn and visible at all times while in the facility.
- No one will be allowed to visit if they are exhibiting COVID-like or flu-like symptoms. These include cough, fever, headache, sore throat, chills, aches, runny or stuffy nose, vomiting, diarrhea, and new loss of taste or smell.
- Patients in the Medical-Surgical unit, Emergency Department, and the OB unit are allowed one visitor. No visitors will be allowed for patients with suspected or confirmed COVID-19.
 - Acute inpatients and observation patients – must be the same visitor throughout the hospitalization
 - Swing bed patients – one visitor per day but can be a different visitor each day
 - Emergency Department patients – must be the same visitor throughout the ED visit
 - OB patients – must be the same visitor throughout the hospitalization
- Surgery patients are not allowed visitors unless it is deemed that the patient needs a caretaker, i.e., pediatric patient, developmentally disabled, cognitively impaired
- Clinic patients are not allowed visitors unless it is deemed that the patient needs a caretaker, i.e., pediatric patient, developmentally disabled, cognitively impaired
- Pediatric patients on the Medical-Surgical unit are allowed two support persons (parents or guardians) throughout their hospitalization.
- Children under the age of 18 are not allowed to visit except in cases with extenuating circumstances.
- Visitation practices for Hospice or End of Life patients will be determined on an individual basis.
