- Welcome to 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten (1KBBK) at Valdez Consortium Library! 1KBBK is a national program that encourages early literacy and kindergarten readiness by creating a habit of reading with your child every day.
- Reading just three books per day adds up to 1,000 books in just one year!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Does it count if we read a book more than once?

YES! Read the same book as many times as you would like! Studies show that repetition is good for developing brains, so break out that favorite book over and over (and over and over...).

How do we get a new reading log?

Bring your finished log into the library! You will receive the next sheet and your child will receive a sticker for their achievement!

What happens when we complete the program?

Congratulations! When you and your child have read 1,000 books, your child will receive a new book to keep! If you and your child are willing, we will also take a picture of your child to mark their accomplishment.
