#### Prince William Sound College announces new site coordinator Alyssa Kleissler to replace Susan Harding at the Prince William Sound College By Jane Spencer– May 27, 2022

On Tuesday, May 24, Prince William Sound College announced Alyssa Kleissler will be the new Cordova Extension Site Coordinator, a position held by Susan Harding for 21 years until her retirement. The director of PWSC, Dan O'Connor, made the announcement and thanked Harding for her contributions, "After 21 years of commitment to Cordova, we're so thankful to you."

In attendance were members of the community and students of Kleissler's Spanish classes. O'Connor expressed confidence in Kleissler taking over the responsibilities.

"She'll do great, she's been teaching for us for a number of years and done a great job," O'Connor said. "I think she has a lot of excitement and enthusiasm."

Harding echoed the sentiments about Kleissler.

"She's gonna be great, it's going to be a good thing," Harding said.

With 24 years of teaching experience, Kleissler knows what she'd like to focus on.

"I would like to work with some students that aren't necessarily college bound students, but would like to get their associates degree, or would like to open up their own business," Kleissler said. "I want to support the entrepreneurs."



According to O'Connor, he sees tremendous opportunity in Cordova because of the different communities here and PWSC strives to serve and have a broader impact on the community. With community interest programs, enrichment classes, Alaska Native Arts, teacher training programs and education related to the fishing industry, he thinks a variety of offerings will serve the community of Cordova well. The mission of Prince William Sound College is "to use its unique resources and magnificent landscape to enrich the lives of our students and our communities."

Last month Dr. Benjamin Rush, Assistant Professor of Outdoor Leadership, and TJ Miller, Chair and Associate Professor HPER Dept., University of Alaska Anchorage, traveled with students Carrie, Eli, Sarah, Auj, Rafael, Cooper, Sarah, LiAn, and Andrew from Whittier to Valdez.

As part of their end of the semester capstone project, the students planned all the necessary details for their kayaking expedition. Putting their previous course work and Outdoor Leadership instruction into practice, Dr. Rush explained that the students designed the route, prepared the equipment, and purchased and prepared the food needed for their adventure.



#### TJ Miller

For professor TJ Miller, the PWSC Outdoor Leadership capstone trip was nothing short of a success. Having spent the last two weeks paddling with students from Whittier to Valdez, Miller says he would "absolutely do it again."

Miller, Chair and Associate Professor for UAA's HPER department, and PWSC's Assistant Professor of Outdoor Leadership, Dr. Benjamin Rush spent 14 days with Outdoor Leadership students, paddling across Price William Sound. While as Miller shares, "the weather the first few days really challenged students to pay attention and keep their gear dry," the remainder of the trip proved to be beautifully sunny, allowing the students and instructors a chance to commune with nature.

For Miller, this trip has been on his bucket list for decades. He shares, "Just being in nature and being disconnected for two weeks from my hectic daily life provided me respite and rejuvenation. I have had this trip on my bucket list since I came to AK 20 years ago, I finally got to complete the journey."

# Sarah King

For Outdoor Leadership student Sarah King, the PWSC capstone trip was not only a chance to put classroom skills into practice, but it was also a time for reflection and meditation.

During the two-week kayaking trip from Whittier to Valdez, students took turns being the "leader of the day." When King took on this role, she wanted fellow students and her PWSC professors to focus on being present, being in the moment. She shares, "I encouraged others to take time to write their thoughts and feelings down. We ended up having a little open mic on the beach by a fire and sharing poems / stories while we watched the sky change."

For King and the other PWSC students, the trip was an unforgettable experience that brought them closer to nature and to each other. "I love these individuals immensely and I am so grateful for this experience with them. Seeing everyone's growth in the past two weeks, including my own, has been incredible."

"It was a challenging and amazing trip. We spent the first three nights in Whitter due to weather. Some of our gear... clothes, sleeping bags, tents, and even "waterproof" gear, got soaked. After we left Whittier, the sky cleared up and we were able to dry our gear!"

Andrew shared some of the highlights of the trip:

"We were surrounded by nature and God's Beauty 24/7. People get caught up in life, they forget where we live and the incredible sights. You only hear natural sounds and see natural light. It makes you focus and think with ease. You realize that all you have and who you have is very important, and it makes you treat every little thing with respect and love.
