



Algonac

The beauty of Algonac, situated on the largest fresh-water delta in the world and nicknamed the "Venice of Michigan", is highlighted by the many canals that wind throughout the city and the beautiful boardwalk along the St. Clair River.

Algonac's nautical history includes being the birthplace of Chris Craft Boats and former home of Gar Wood, a wellknown builder and racer of power boats. Algonac also hosts an annual festival, the Pickerel Tournament, which includes a fishing tournament, carnival and fireworks. Events include the Antique & Classic Boat Show, Algonac Art Fair and other fun festivals.

Just south of Algonac is the St. John's Marsh area. The marsh is a wildlife refuge that offer open and managed hunting. It's home to many different water fowl and close to 160 different kinds of prairie wildflowers and grasses. 

State of Michigan passed legislation allowing approved communities to establish a social district granting participating establishments to sell alcohol for off-premises consumption within common areas.

So what is a social district?

A social district is a well-defined area within a jurisdiction—in this case, from Glenwood Ave, to Union St.—where the outdoor consumption of alcoholic beverages has been legalized.

How does it work?

Visit one of the participating establishments and order your drink of choice in a special social district cup.



McMorran Plaza Summer Debut

A multi-year project is coming to an end this summer with the completion and opening of the redesigned plaza and beer garden. The addition of synthetic turf, a splash pad and elevated stage will provide a venue for family friendly activities. And, the new plaza and beer garden's plan to have music and live entertainment every weekend this summer is just more reason to visit the downtown area during the summer months.

McMorran Place's outdoor summer music series will feature live entertainment on the plaza and in the beer garden,

Michigan's First 100% Electric Transit Buses

The Blue Water Area Transit Commission (BWATC) introduced two Proterra battery-electric buses to the BWATC fleet in July 2021, becoming the first public transit agency in Michigan to operate electric transit buses in its transportation fleet and the first in the State of Michigan to put 100% battery electric buses into service. The one hour trolley tour runs June - August and includes a swing by various local points of interest. The tour, which is only 10 cents, takes you through the heart of Port Huron and along the riverfront for a panoramic glimpse of the Blue Water Bridges, the Thomas Edison Depot and Statue and the Fort Gratiot Light Station. The starting point for each run is downtown Port Huron at 331 Huron Avenue, with additional pickup points designated along the route such as at the Blue Water Convention Center and Vantage Point. Blue Water River Walk



The Blue Water River Walk is almost one-mile of St. Clair River shoreline immediately south of the mouth of the Black River in Port Huron, Michigan. It is less than a mile downriver from the Blue Water Bridge to Sarnia and the southern end of Lake Huron. Owned by the Community Foundation of St. Clair County, the Blue Water River Walk is open to the public year-round.

The shoreline used to create this beautiful River Walk was donated to the Community Foundation of St. Clair County by local philanthropist James C. Acheson at Christmas of 2011.

Observation Dock: the old railroad ferry dock, which dates back to the early 1900's, has been fully restored and re-opened to the public. Once used to help transport goods back-and-forth to Sarnia, the Ferry Dock is now a beautiful patio overlooking the St. Clair River.



Pedestrian Trail: using partial funding from the Transportation Enhancement Grant Program of MDOT, the Community Foundation raised matching private donations that allowed us to build a 10' wide asphalt pedestrian trail along the entire length of the shoreline. This trail is a key component of the Bridge to Bay Trail system.

Outdoor Classroom: At the north end of the River Walk, just north of the Observation Dock, is our Outdoor Classroom. Intended as a true interactive learning environment, the Outdoor Classroom is meant to teach the public about the St. Clair River ecosystem and the plant and wildlife habitat found along the River Walk.

Shoreline & Habitat Restoration: Approximately 4,300 feet of St. Clair River shoreline was completely restored and rehabilitated in 2013, utilizing the grant funding from the GLRI. In the spring of 2014 we completed our shallow water habitat restoration efforts. During this work, and including the Pilot Phase work done in 2012, almost 7,000 tons of debris was removed from the site.

County Wetlands Park: Our partners at St. Clair County Parks & Recreation received a \$1 million grant to develop a new wetlands park on the very southern end of the River Walk.

Fishing Pier: To help enhance public access for fishing and recreation, the Community Foundation built a fishing pier on the southern end of the River Walk, just south of the Gray Fox ship.

Public Art: One of the many fantastic enhancements of the Blue Water River Walk is public art. Adding public art and artifacts is another way we have been able to embellish our River Walk and make it more interesting for visitors.

Wrigley Center Development



largest collection of implements in the nation that date from the early 1800s to the early 1900s. The museum, located in Port Huron, boasts over 10,000 sq. ft. and displays over 5,000 items. From old ice picks to horse drawn ice wagons, visitors experience real history brought to life. The museum's

collection also includes antique cars, an antique ice truck, a license plate collection, a milk industry bottle collection and milk trucks, an antique collection of hundreds of dolls and buggies and a gift shop.

Michigan was one of the main sources of ice harvesting because in those times people cherished the clear blue ice harvested from the beautiful Great Lakes. Once cleared, measured and cut, the 300 lb. blocks of ice were loaded onto horse drawn flatbed wagons and taken to the ice house, where they stacked and packed, using sawdust for insulation. The blocks were delivered by wagon to homes and

business for use in ice boxes to keep food fresh.

The museum is located at 317 Grand River Ave., Port Huron. A small admission charge is requested. Guided tours are available for kids and adults.


Maritime Center/Vantage Point

1380 WPHM News/Talk/ Sports is celebrating its 75th year anniversary. The station, originally known as WTTH, signed on the air December 6th, 1947. In 1961 the power was boosted to provide a reliable signal to all of St. Clair County and areas further north in the Thumb. The current call letters,

WPHM, were adopted in 1967.

Throughout much of WPHM's 75 years on the air the station played soft adult music with a heavy emphasis on news and sports. Shortly after being acquired by Liggett Communications, WPHM became all news-talk and the home of the **WPHM Morning Show with Paul Miller**. WPHM

Fort Gratiot Lighthouse

The original Fort Gratiot Lighthouse was established in 1825 to guard the juncture of Lake Huron and the St. Clair River. That lighthouse was destroyed by a storm in 1828 and the current lighthouse, the oldest in Michigan, was built north of the fort in 1829. The white painted brick tower was extended from 74' to its present 86' in the early 1860s. The green flashing light was automated in 1933 and updated in 2016 and can be seen from 16 miles out in Lake Huron.

The entire campus has undergone a historic restoration under the ownership of St. Clair County Parks & Recreation



Commission and the Port Huron Museum.

Weather permitting, the Fort Gratiot Lighthouse is one of the few operating lighthouses that allow visitors to climb the tower and step out onto the catwalk for a breathtaking view. From the gallery, visitors can view the Blue Water Bridge, the mouth of the St. Clair River, Point Edward, Ontario and Lake Huron to the north.

Port Huron Float Down




It's the Blue Water Area's favorite unorganized, unsanctioned, and unsponsored event ... it's called the Port Huron Float Down, and it somehow seems to take place every third Sunday in August, despite a cancellation each and every year by the United States Coast Guard.

The event sees 3,000 or more people gathering at Lighthouse Beach in the early afternoon and floating down the St. Clair River to Marysville. There's even a website, but those who run it at porthuronfloatdown.com say they are in no way organizing, sponsoring, planning, or promoting the community event.

According to the site, the Float Down is a tradition steeped in history, even though it's impossible to know who the first people were to float down. The event, as it's known today, dates back over 30 years. In 1986, a storm put an end to the fun, and it was officially ended by the United States Coast Guard in 1987. Although people continued to float every year, the Float Down did not officially resurface until 2008.

The traditional course of the Float Down is launching at Lighthouse (Conger) Beach, and then floating 8-miles downstream to Chrysler Beach in Marysville. The current moves quickest under the Blue Water Bridges, and then pulls you out towards the center of the river, near the mouth of the Black River. If you want to watch, the Edison Parkway, the Flag Plaza, the Blue Water Bridges, Pine Grove Park, Kiefer Park, or Lincoln Park are all the best places to watch the floaters

If you decide to float down the St. Clair River in August, there are several things you must consider before jumping in. The current is swift and the water is cold. All floaters should have a reliable inflatable and a paddle so they are able to stay out of the shipping channel. It's also wise to choose a float that can keep you dry and out of the water to prevent heat loss or hypothermia. Floaters should also have a Personal Floatation Device or a Life Jacket. Children should wear them at all times and adults should at least keep them at an arm's-length reach at all times. Most importantly, if you cannot swim, do not enter the water. There are no lifeguards or safety personnel.



Art on the River





The annual Art on the River is a 3-day art festival held in Keifer Park, on the banks of the St. Clair River, 500 Merchant Street, Port Huron. This festival is all about art. Many artisans will be sharing their creations, from paintings, glass work or jewelry, to crafters and musicians. Art on the River is a family friendly event with art workshops, hands on art, music and food to enjoy.

Art on the River's featured artist is Mike Henry. Mr. Henry, a watermedia landscape painter working primarily with watercolor, is a native of Port Huron, Michigan.



2022 Bayview Mackinac Race

This year's Port Huron to Mackinac race will be the 98th consecutive year when the sailboats leave the starting line in southern Lake Huron on **Saturday, July 16th**.

Almost 200 boats are expected to compete in this year's race. The boats are measured to determine handicaps, which are subtracted from their elapsed sailing time, except for the scratch boat. The scratch boat is the fastest boat in the fleet and is granted no time allowance handicap. The smallest boats start the race first, typically reaching the finish line on Mackinac Island on Sunday, with larger vessels arriving by Tuesday.

Changes made in 2016 determine which course the boats can take. The changes set a "speed limit" for participation on the Shore Course, the shorter of the event's two courses, which follows the Michigan shoreline and covers 235 statute miles. The Shore Course is no longer an option for larger boats with a PHRF rating below 99 seconds per mile. The faster boats must sail the longer Cove Island course, a distance of 298 statute miles. Slower boats will have the option of sailing either course. GPS tracking devices are placed on all participating sailboats so that fans from around the world are able to follow individual boats or the entire fleet on the Bayview Yacht Club website at **bycmack.com.**



St. Clair Boat Harbor



Situated on the Pine River, a tributary of the beautiful St. Clair River, the Saint Clair Boat Harbor has earned its reputation as first class accommodation for boaters arriving from throughout the Great Lakes area. It is a spectacular marina centered in the Blue Water Area and located just minutes from the downtown of quaint and serene St. Clair.

Officially named for community pioneer Charles F. Moore, the municipal harbor boasts floating and fixed docks as a part of the main harbor and broad-side docking on the city-side of the river. The well-planned mix of harbor features and

amenities complement the diversity of opportunities that exist within the harbor confines.

The Harbormaster's building offers washrooms and showers 24 hours daily during the boating season. A boat launch, kayak and canoe rentals and launch ramp, and a cleaning station for the fishermen are also available.

Taking a drive north of Lexington, along the shoreline of Lake Huron, can be a great way to spend the day. It will take a full day to travel the coast to Port Austin and back, with stops along the way, but you will be rewarded with some interesting attractions that may make you want to return to spend more time in these villages and towns on the sunrise side of Michigan.

Port Sanilac is home to the Port Sanilac

Lighthouse and a beautiful marina. Close by under the waters of Lake Huron, is the 163-acre Sanilac Shores Underwater Preserve. This preserve has at least 16 shipwrecks for those that are interested in diving. The Sanilac County Historic Village and Museum offers a glimpse into what life was like in the area in the 1800's.

Harbor Beach also boasts a lighthouse and visitors can travel the paved, multi-use Harbor View Trail to take in the water views.

Port Hope offers another lighthouse that still serves as an active navigational aid, the Pointe Aux Barques Lighthouse and Museum at the Lighthouse County Park.

Port Austin The Port Crescent State Park offers visitors a taste of the Lake Huron coast with a



boardwalk through the small sand dune grass and beach for swimming.

Charters are available on Lake Huron and Saginaw Bay for those wanting to spend more time in the area. A stop in close by Grindstone City and a visit to the General Store will give visitors a chance to enjoy what they say is the biggest ice cream cones in the Thumb. Grindstone City was the site of a quarry and produced grindstones used for milling and many are visible and scattered throughout the area.

Named for its distinctive shape and a major attraction in the area, Turnip Rock is a destination for kayak and canoe enthusiasts and can only be reached by water.

Sandusky is located 15 miles west of Lake Huron in the center of Sanilac County. It was incorporated in 1905 and has grown to offer all of the services and resources of a much larger city, while maintaining its rural character and small town appeal.

Visitors will find quaint antique and specialty shops, restaurants, bars and a movie theater in the downtown shopping district. Big box retailers, and auto, farm and power equipment dealers are located nearby. Michigan's oldest drive-in theater, the Hi-Way Drive-In, is just east of town and open from Memorial Day through Labor

Goodells is home to the Goodells County Park and plays host to the annual St. Clair County 4H Fair. Adjacent to the park is the St. Clair County Farm Museum and Historical village for those wanting to learn more about the agricultural heritage of the area. The Pine River Nature Center, also

located nearby, offers visitors three miles of hiking trails year round from dawn to dusk. It's a popular spot for bird watchers with more than 70 species of birds sighted at the property. Wadhams, a small community west of Port Huron, is located on the banks of the Black River. Due to its easy access to I-69 and I-94, it continues to thrive and

to get into town. It's known as home to "The Thing", a selfpropelled vehicle, powered by a steam engine, built in 1884-1885 by Thomas and John Clegg in their Memphis machine shop. The historical marker states that The Thing was «the first recorded self-propelled vehicle in Michigan (and perhaps the country)» and that «It ran about 500 miles». But addition to these unique facts, you'd also find that Memphis is a pleasant place to live. It's proximity to the suburbs of Detroit makes it a great place to call home and still have access to the big city. The Memphis Chamber of Commerce hosts an annual Memphis Days Festival the first full weekend of August. The festival includes carnival games, kids events, a parade down main street, a 5k race, and vintage baseball to name a few of the activities.

Blue Water Area Trails

Wadhams to Avoca Trail

The 12 mile long Wadhams to Avoca trail, a former railroad grade developed as a pedestrian pathway, begins just west of Port Huron and ends in the small community of Avoca. Access points, including parking lots and restrooms, are located at Wadhams Road, Lapeer Road, Imlay City Road, and at M-136 in Avoca. As you trek west along



the trail from Port Huron, you'll notice the landscape change from suburban to rural to wilderness. The eastern half of the trail is paved, while the western portion is made of limestone fines to accommodate horseback riders. The pinnacle of your journey is the Mill Creek Trestle, a 640 foot long and 60 foot high former railroad bridge that offers spectacular views of the Mill Creek and beyond. Bring your camera and binoculars, as abundant forms of wildlife can be found along your journey. More information can be found at stclaircounty.org/ Offices/parks/.

Bridge to Bay Trail

The Bridge to Bay Trail is a 54 mile long network of trails through several communities on St. Clair County's shoreline. The trail starts near the Blue Water Bridge in Port Huron and travels south to Anchor Bay on Lake St. Clair. Along the way you'll encounter parks, beaches, museums, lighthouses, shops, and restaurants. Many miles of the trail are paved for hiking and biking. Other portions of the trail consist of dedicated bike lanes and sidewalks. Some sections remain under development. A portion of the Bridge to Bay Trail in Port Huron consists of the Blue Water River Walk, a prime example of the ongoing effort to restore our shoreline. Starting at the mouth of the Black River and ending at the Seaway Terminal, the Blue Water River Walk tells the story of the river's industrial and natural past. Cast a line into the

river at the former Pere Marquette ferry apron turned fishing pier, or dip your toes into the water along the living shoreline. Visit bridgetobay.org for more information.

Pine River Nature Center

St. Clair County Regional Education Service Agency's Pine River Nature Center is located on Castor Road immediately south of Goodells County Park. The 80 acre nature center has over three miles of hiking trails that are open year round from dawn to dusk. The nature center is also a popular spot for bird watchers with more than 70 species of birds sighted at the property. Numerous educational programs for area students and the public take place inside the nature center's 5,000 square foot log cabin which features interactive nature displays. The center's newest addition is a universally accessible treehouse that is open to the public. More information on the Pine River Nature Center can be found at sccresa.org.

Blue Water Fishing

You don't need a boat to fish, but if you have one there are many boat launches throughout the area. In many of the Blue Water communities, there are long stretches of public seawall available to the shore fishermen. Whether you're catching fish out of your boat or from the shore, it will require a stop at one of the local bait and tackle stores to get the "good



stuff' and info on local tried and true techniques and advice on fishing from the seawalls. Depending on the time of year, you could catch King salmon, Chinook salmon, Atlantic salmon, Steelhead, Brown Trout, Lake Trout, Walleye, Silver Bass, Small Mouth Bass, Sturgeon, Whitefish, Muskie, Northern Pike, Suckers, and Carp.

Paddling the Port Huron State Game Area

Natural scenes that you may have thought could only be found in northern Michigan are just a short drive west of Port Huron. The Port Huron State Game Area is over 6,000 acres and located along the Black River in Clyde and Grant Townships. The site offers opportunities for small game hunting, fishing, hiking, and nature study. The best way to take advantage of all the game area has to offer is by canoe or kayak. Since it is protected state land, many miles of the river are undeveloped and it's more likely that you'll encounter a bald eagle than a fellow human being.

Information on weather conditions as well as the depth and speed of the water at the Jeddo Bridge gauging station is available at https://waterdata.usgs.gov. Access to the river is possible at the Jeddo Bridge, Comstock Bridge, Norman Bridge, M-136/Beard Bridge, Woodsong County Park and Wadhams Bridge (listed from north to south according to the map to the left).



Island Loop Route National Water Trail

The Island Loop National Water Trail is the first national water trail in Michigan and one of only fourteen in the nation. The 10.2 mile long trail provides boaters and paddlers with a oneof-a-kind opportunity to navigate four bodies of water, pass by Michigan's oldest lighthouse and travel underneath the Blue Water Bridges.

Most of the water trail meanders through Fort Gratiot Township, Port Huron Township and the City of Port Huron, traveling the Black River, the Black River Canal, Lake Huron and the St. Clair River. With the exception of the waters under the Blue Water Bridge and in the St. Clair River, waterways along the route are calm and slow but you should wear a life jacket (PFD) at all times. Also be sure to have your ID with you, as the waters of Lake Huron and the St. Clair River are patrolled by Border Patrol Agents and they can stop you at any time and ask for proof of your citizenship.

Begin your journey either at the new Bakers Field Park in Port Huron Township or at the North River Road Park in Ft. Gratiot Township. Both sites have an ADA accessible kayak launches. Head downriver then east on the canal that links the Black River to Lake Huron. Enter Lake Huron after passing under the Taintor Gate. The Taintor Gate is open 96% of the time but be



aware that it closes automatically when there is a strong North or Northeast wind.

Once in Lake Huron, head south and paddle under the Blue Water Bridges and into the St. Clair River. along the international border with Canada. The St. Clair **River** section should only be attempted by experienced paddlers on a calm day. The water can be quite rough and the paddle is best attempted in the morning. Finish by entering the mouth of the Black River to the west, paddling through the City of Port Huron and then you're back to where vou started from.

The Blue Water Bridge is an international crossing between the United States of America and the Dominion of Canada. As you enter either country you will be stopped and questioned prior to entry into that country. Each person in your vehicle must be able to prove their citizenship. For a complete list of Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative-compliant documents, visit the United States Department of Homeland Security at dhs.gov/files/crossingborders/travelers.shtm.

Identification Requirements (from cbp.gov/us-citizens/western-hemisphere-travel-initiative)

What types of documents are accepted for entry into the United States via land and sea?

- U.S. citizens can present a valid: U.S. Passport; Passport Card; Enhanced Driver's License; Trusted Traveler Program card (NEXUS, SENTRI or FAST), American Indian Card or Enhanced Tribal Card.
- U.S. and Canadian citizen children under the age of 16 (or under 19, if traveling with a school, religious group, or other youth group) need only present a birth certificate or other proof of citizenship. The birth certificate can be original, photocopy, or certified copy.
- WHTI does not affect U.S. Lawful Permanent Residents, who are still required to present their permanent resident card (Form I-551) or other valid evidence of permanent residence status.
- Canadian citizens can present a valid passport, Enhanced Driver's License, or Trusted Traveler Program card (NEXUS, SENTRI or FAST).
