

Beginning September 29th, YCS K-5 students return to classes 4 days a week. K-5 with a modified schedule dismissing at 11:45 am. Mondays will be a drop-off / pick-up day with teacher planning for the week.

Parents would pick up students at dismissal or choose to allow them to ride school buses home or remain on campus to complete assignments and receive tutoring until the Magic Program begins at 2:30 p.m.

Virtual classes beginning at 12:30 p.m. and dismissing at 2:⁴⁵~~30~~ p.m. The \$30,000 in stimulus funding can be used to provide tutors and aids for student instruction until dismissal or the Magic Program begins.

If further child care is needed, students would be allowed to stay and participate in the Magic Program. This will provide for a planning period for teachers as well as ensuring the needs of our communities are met. Parents actually have four choices:

1. To choose whether their child is seated or virtual
2. To pick up their child at 11:45 a.m. if that is convenient for them or a family member – or ride the bus home ⁴⁵
3. Pick up their child at 2:⁴⁵~~30~~ p.m. prior to Magic
4. Allow their child to participate in the Magic Program and at its conclusion, either pick up their child or be transported home by YCS Magic bus.

Elementary teachers would have a planning period during scheduled pull outs or between seated and virtual classes.

Grades 6-12 would resume classes on October 6, 2020.

Grades 6-8 will attend school in two clusters – T/W and Th/F
Mondays are remote learning day for students, and teacher planning for the week.

Grades 9-12 will attend school in two clusters – T/W and Th/F
Mondays are remote learning day for students, and teacher planning for the week.
Two Mondays a month will be ½ virtual days for faculty professional development.

At school dismissal, bus transportation will be provided as usual.

These plans are to be executed following specific health and safety protocol and guidelines for Covid-19.
