Representative of the Estate of Susan A. Cox ("Estate"), and for Susan Cox, and filed in the above court under its diversity jurisdiction. The death of Susan A. Cox was caused by medical negligence as defined by RCW 7.70.030(1), and (3), and RCW 7.70.040 and .050. The Plaintiffs claim as follows:

I. PARTIES, JURISDICTION, AND VENUE

- 1.1 Mark Cox is over the age of 18, and the widow of his now deceased wife, Susan Cox (D.O.B. May 17, 1968, and D.O.D. August 15, 2022).
- 1.2 Mark Cox is the personal representative of the deceased, Susan A.Cox (deceased), and acting on behalf of the Estate of Susan Cox.
- 1.3 Mark Cox and Susan Cox married on April 4, 1995 in the state of Nevada.
- 1.4 Mark Cox is entitled to bring this action for the wrongful death of his spouse Susan Cox, for her benefit, for his benefit, and for the benefit of her estate, including her stepdaughter Jamie Marie Glunt, for all damages caused, under RCW 4.20.010, .020, .046 and .060.
- 1.5 Mark Cox and his wife Susan A. Cox and Mark resided in Albion,Whitman County, Washington, at all material times herein.
 - 1.6 Defendant Gritman Medical Center is a citizen of Idaho as it has been COMPLAINT FOR DAMAGES
 Page 2 of 18

incorporated in Idaho and has its principal place of business there. 28 U.S.C.A. § 1332.

- 1.7 Defendant Gritman directs its conduct at the state of Washington, because, in relevant part, it publicly states so, it intentionally solicits business from the state of Washington, and it affiliates operationally with the Pullman Regional Hospital in Pullman, Washington.
- 1.8 Defendant Gritman has variously been incorporated in the state of Washington under doing "business as" names such as dba Palouse Clinic, but its incorporation in Washington is believed to have expired.
- 1.9 Defendant Gritman does business as Moscow Family Medicine, which is located in Moscow, Idaho, and which is also engaged in the business of providing medical care to patients in the state of Washington, and in particular relevance here, providing medical care and direction to Susan Cox in Whitman County in the state of Washington, as well as providing her care in the state of Idaho.
- 1.10 Defendants Gritman and Gritman d/b/a/Moscow Family Medicine (hereafter "Gritman" collectively) are, and were at all material times herein, health care providers subject to RCW 7.70.020.

- 1.11 Defendant Patricia N. Marciano, M.D. is, and was, a physician employed by Defendant Gritman at its Moscow Family Medicine location at all material times herein.
- 1.12 Defendant Marciano is, and was at all material times herein, a health care provider subject to RCW 7.70.020.
- 1.13 Defendant Mariano engaged in the business of providing medical care to Susan Cox, who was known to Defendant to reside primarily in Whitman County, Washington.
- 1.14 Defendant physician Patricia Marciano also affiliates with Pullman Regional Hospital.
- 1.15 Defendant Bledsoe PA-C, is, and was, a physician's assistant employed by Defendant Gritman at its Moscow Family Medicine location at all material times herein.
- 1.16 Defendant Bledsoe is, and was at all material times herein, a health care provider subject to RCW 7.70.020.
- 1.17 Defendants collectively provided health care services to Susan A.Cox in Idaho, and in Albion, Whitman County, Washington.
 - 1.18 Defendant Gritman assigned primary care provider, Patricia

Marciano, to act as Susan Cox's primary care provider while Cox resided in Albion, Whitman County, Washington.

- 1.19 Defendants Gritman, Marciano, and Bledsoe placed Susan Cox on an ongoing prescriptive medication treatment program, and directed her treatment with prescription medication, in and from Idaho, in and into Whitman County, Washington.
- 1.20 Defendants used Rite-Aid Pharmacy (NYSE "RAD") in Pullman, Washington to dispense the drugs Defendants prescribed to Susan Cox in Idaho, and in Whitman County, Washington.
- 1.21 All Defendants purposefully directed their actions at and into the state of Washington for purposes of this case by accepting and treating Susan Cox over a period of no less than six years, acting as her primary care provider.
- 1.22 The medical treatment and directives by and through the drugs provided by Defendants to Susan Cox in Idaho and in Washington caused injury and death to Susan Cox.
 - 1.23 The same medical treatment caused injury to Plaintiff Mark Cox.
 - 1.24 The same medical treatment caused injury to Jamie Mari Glunt.
 - 1.25 This Court has original jurisdiction over this claim via diversity

jurisdiction, in that the matter in controversy exceeds the sum or value of \$75,000, exclusive of interest and costs, and is between citizens of different States, per 28 U.S.C.A. § 1332. Complete diversity exists between Plaintiffs and Defendants.

- 1.26 Washington has specific jurisdiction over the nonresident Defendants based upon their nexus with the decedent and the relevant events leading to the suffering and death of Susan Cox.
- 1.27 Venue is proper in the Eastern District of Washington per 28 USC.
 1391 (b) (2) in that a substantial part of the events or omissions giving rise to the claim occurred in this District.
- 1.28 Defendant Gritman is liable under the doctrine of corporate negligence, respondeat superior, agency, ostensible agency, and vicarious liability.

II. FACTS

- 2.1 Susan A. Cox, DOB: 05/17/68, now deceased, was a resident of Whitman County, Washington, with her surviving spouse, Mark Cox.
 - 2.2 Mark Cox is a resident of Whitman County, Washington
- 2.3 Since at least the year 2014, Susan Cox experienced ongoing cervical and lumbar spine pain from injuries.
 - 2.4 Since at least the year 2014, Susan Cox received primary care

medical treatment through Gritman and its affiliates and operating entities in Moscow, Idaho, as well as in its interaction with the Pullman Regional Hospital in Pullman, Washington.

- 2.5 Defendants assigned primary care physician Patricia Marciano to Susan Cox to act as Susan Cox's primary care provider, and Defendant Todd Bledsoe was assigned as Susan Cox's PA-C.
- 2.6 Dating back to the year 2016, Defendants individually and collectively engaged in pain management for Susan Cox by prescribing Susan Cox varying types of prescription pain medication, in varying doses, and in varying combinations.
- 2.7 During these times, Defendants were aware that Susan Cox had periods of alcohol abuse and was susceptible to abuse of prescription medications.
- 2.8 During these times, Defendants, through various employees and agents, prescribed and directed Susan Cox to obtain and take medications including, but not limited to, repeated prescriptions and refills of, and often in combinations of, the following:
 - a. hydrocodone-acetaminophen 5-325, which is an opioid cough

suppressant, and which can interact with and increase the risk of serious side effects (such as slow/shallow breathing, severe drowsiness/dizziness) if taken with other products that may also cause drowsiness or breathing problems, such as other opioid pain or cough relievers (such as codeine, hydromorphone), alcohol, marijuana (cannabis), drugs for sleep or anxiety (such as alprazolam, lorazepam, zolpidem), muscle relaxants (such as carisoprodol, cyclobenzaprine), or antihistamines (such as cetirizine, diphenhydramine), and/or with drugs for sleep or anxiety (such as alprazolam, lorazepam, zolpidem), and including Diazepam; ¹

b. Oxycodone-Acetominophen 7.5-325 MG oral tablets, which is an opioid similar to hydrocodone, and which can interact with certain drugs that depress the central nervous system, and can lower

breathing and heart rate, such as benzodiazepines and other sedatives and muscle relaxants;

c. Diazepam (generic name Valium, 5 MG oral tablets), which is a nonopioid benzodiazepine, which can interact with hydrocodone and other drugs for sleep or anxiety (such as alprazolam, lorazepam, zolpidem), and which may increase the risk of serious side effects (such as slow/shallow breathing, severe drowsiness/dizziness) if taken with other products that may also cause drowsiness or breathing problems, including opioid pain or cough relievers (such as codeine, hydrocodone), alcohol, marijuana (cannabis), and/or other drugs for sleep or anxiety (such as alprazolam, lorazepam, zolpidem), relaxants carisoprodol, muscle (such as cyclobenzaprine), antihistamines cetirizine, (such or as diphenhydramine).²

d. Tramadol HCL 50 mg oral tablets (narcotic medicine, synthetic

opioid analgesic used to help relieve physical pain), which can interact with other opioid pain or cough relievers (such as codeine, hydrocodone), and/or drugs for sleep or anxiety (such as alprazolam, lorazepam, zolpidem), muscle relaxants (such as carisoprodol, cyclobenzaprine), or antihistamines (such as cetirizine, diphenhydramine);³

- e. Celebrex, which is a nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID), specifically a COX-2 inhibitor, which relieves pain and swelling, but which will increase the level or effect of hydrocodone by altering drug metabolism.⁴
- 2.9 The level and duration of Defendants' treatment prescribed and directed caused addiction which became evident, and was not addressed by defendants, who continued prescribing and directing more and more such treatment.

- 2.10 By February 11, 2021, Defendants intended to increase the level of benzodiazepam prescriptions but were notified by Susan Cox's insurer that the insurer would no longer allow prescriptions for narcotic pain medicines plus benzodiazepines if the Defendants were already prescribing and directing more than one such prescription, and they were already doing so, as Susan Cox was already being prescribed diazepam. ⁵
- 2.11 By May 2022, Susan Cox, who had been performing as a cashier and handling her employer's accounts receivable was displaying and experiencing cognitive difficulty, including confusion, sufficient to results in her termination from her workplace.
- 2.12 Plaintiff Mark Cox repeatedly contacted Defendants and his wife Susan Co's pharmacy to express his concerns about the level of prescription medications his wife was being prescribed and directed to take, but providers would not speak to him because of Washington's laws regarding heath care information protection.

- 2.13 Mark Cox repeatedly told his wife Susan Cox that she was being harmed by the prescription medications she was directed to take; but Susan Cox understood from Defendants that these prescriptions were correct, proper, and necessary, and were to be taken as prescribed.
- 2.14 By August 2, 2022, Defendants were aware that Susan Cox was falling down, falling out of bed, and on that date, Defendants observed for themselves and noted in Susan Cox's chart:

Feels confused and out of it. Repeating herself. On exam today she seemed slightly confused and kept repeating herself. She appeared dazed.

- 2.15 On August 2, 2022, with knowledge of such symptoms, and with such symptoms evident, Defendants increased Susan Cox's prescription medications, now adding and directing her to take gabapentin (100 mg capsule three times a day increasing to two capsules three times a day after one week) and sertraline (Zoloft), one tablet per day, in concert with her diazepam, oxycodone-acetaminophen, propranolol, and Celebrex.
 - 2.16 Susan Cox took these prescriptions as directed.
- 2.17 On August 15, 2022, while at home and in bed, Susan Cox became unresponsive.

- 2.18 On August 15, 2022, Susan Cox died.
- 2.19 Susan Cox's death was caused by brain swelling, and excess fluid in and around the lungs, which are commonly seen in the setting of drug overdose. Susan Cox's cause of death was determined to be "the toxic effects of multiple drugs (oxycodone, sertraline, gabapentin, diazepam)," hypoxic ischemic encephalopathy, pulmonary edema, and aspiration pneumonia.
- 2.20 Susan Cox showed no indication of medical findings consistent with Alzheimer's dementia or demyelinating disease which could otherwise have caused the confusion and symptoms of which Defendants were made aware and themselves noted.
- 2.21 Susan Cox's autopsy with toxicology was performed in Spokane County, Washington, at the request of the Whitman County, Washington coroner.
- 2.22 Plaintiff Susan Cox suffered in the months, days, and hours before her death, and during her death, and died as a result of the medical treatment directed by Defendants.
- 2.23 Plaintiff Mark Cox suffered emotionally in the months, days, and hours before his wife's death, and suffered irreparable loss as a result of the medical treatment directed by Defendants.

2.24 Stepdaughter Jamie Glunt has suffered emotionally, and irreparable loss, as a result of the medical treatment directed by Defendants.

III. CAUSES OF ACTION

Plaintiffs reassert all of the above, and further allege as follows:

MEDICAL NEGLIGENCE

- 3.1 All Defendants are health care providers as defined in RCW 7.70.020.
- 3.2 All Defendants failed to follow accepted standards of care under RCW 7.70.030(1) and RCW 7.70.040.
- 3.3 All Defendants directed medical treatment and gave Susan Cox instructions that caused Susan Cox's death.

VIOLATION OF INFORMED CONSENT

3.4 All Defendants failed to provide Susan A. Cox with informed consent as to their treatment and drug dispensing plan, and her death resulted from health care to which she did not consent as a result, per RCW 7.70.030(3), and RCW 7.70.050.

- 3.5 Defendants failed to inform Susan Cox of the material facts of, or facts relating to, her treatment that included multiple drugs including combinations of oxycodone, sertraline, gabapentin, and diazepam.
- 3.6 The referenced mixing of these drugs carried the material risk of causing the adverse signs and symptoms displayed by Susan Cox in the weeks and days prior to her death, and leading to her fatal overdose.
- 3.7 Susan Cox consented to the treatment and directives prescribed her without being aware of or fully informed of such material fact or facts.
- 3.8 No reasonably prudent patient under similar circumstances would have consented to the treatment if informed of such material fact or facts.

RES IPSA LOQUITOR

3.9 Defendants are responsible for the death of Susan A. Cox under res ipsa loquitor liability.

CAUSATION

- 3.10 The treatment directed and failure of informed consent in question proximately caused injury to Susan Cox, and ultimately caused her death.
- 3.11 Defendants' individual and joint conduct resulted in a substantial loss of chance of survival.

- 3.12 Defendants caused Plaintiff Mark Cox substantial emotional suffering and distress, and ultimately the loss of spousal consortium.
- 3.13 Defendants caused stepdaughter Jamie Glunt substantial emotional suffering and distress, and ultimately the loss of parental consortium.

IV. DAMAGES.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiffs reassert all of the above and state as follows:

- 4.1 As a direct and proximate result of the Defendants' breach of the standard of care and failure of informed consent, Susan Cox suffered substantial anxiety, confusion, pain, suffering, distress, frustration, loss of her employment, loss of enjoyment of life, anguish and fear, throughout the time leading up to her death, and physical and emotional anguish, fear, suffering, and distress in her death.
- 4.2 As a direct and proximate result of the Defendants' breach of standard of care and failure of informed consent, Defendants caused Mark Cox, substantial anxiety, confusion, anger, disbelief, pain, suffering, distress, frustration, loss of enjoyment of life, and anguish throughout the time leading up to his wife's death, and anguish, suffering, and physical distress from his wife's

death.

4.3 As a direct and proximate result of the Defendants' breach of standard of care and failure of informed consent, Defendants caused Mark Cox to lose all marital consortium, including his wife's past and continuing love, support, affection, care, companionship, nurturing, advice, guidance, counsel, and society.

4.4 As a direct and proximate result of the breach of standard of care on the part of all Defendants, Susan A. Cox's stepdaughter Jamie Marie Glunt has been deprived of parental consortium, and suffered anguish and emotional distress from her mother's death.

V. <u>RELIEF REQUESTED</u>.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs request:

- 5.1 That judgment be entered against all Defendants jointly and severally for compensation for all loss suffered by Susan Cox, Mark Cox, and the Plaintiff Estate and beneficiaries, for all damages caused by Defendants through their medical negligence and failure of informed consent in the suffering and wrongful death of Decedent Susan A. Cox.
- 5.2 That judgment be entered for any and all further relief available as a matter of law at the time this matter is tried.
