HALF A BILLION DOLLAR POWERBALL JACKPOT

The Powerball jackpot will inch closer to half a billion dollars after no one won the \$414 million drawing on Saturday. The drawing on Wednesday will be worth \$448 million. The numbers for Saturday's drawing were 5-6-45-55-59 with a Powerball of 14. While there was no first place winner, someone in Puerto Rico took home a \$2 million prize and winners in Nebraska and Texas won \$1 million. The \$448 million drawing is the largest Powerball jackpot of 2019 so far, and the 11th-largest Powerball jackpot on record. The odds of winning? One in 292.2 million.

GPS AID IN MULE DEER MANAGEMENT

One hundred and twenty mule deer does are wearing GPS monitoring devices for the second year of a research study designed to aid in the management of mule deer populations in high- and low-density areas of Nebraska. A crew of about 15 people, consisting of graduate students, faculty, and collaborators from the School of Natural Resources at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL), along with Nebraska Game and Parks Commission (NGPC) staff, equipped the deer with monitoring devices after a helicopter capture crew caught them in four study areas last week; two in the northwest and two in the southwest. The GPS devices will allow for remote monitoring via satellite and provide valuable data on movements and habitat use while still allowing researchers to locate the deer on the ground to investigate possible mortalities and other important events. The study is being conducted by UNL professor Dr. John Benson and his team including crew leader Emma Kring. Data from this study will help determine survival rates and factors influencing mortality, habitat use, home range size and movements of adult female and fawn mule deer.

PROPOSAL TO CHANGE CURRENT LAW

Nebraska has long been one of the few states without a "revenge porn" law, but new proposals being considered by lawmakers would end that status and make it easier to file charges against people who post pornographic images of others online without their permission. Although prosecutors might have been able to find ways to file charges for posting such images under current law, Nebraska is among seven states that have not directly addressed the issue, according to the Cyber Civil Rights Initiative, a national nonprofit that tracks the issue in state legislatures. That could change under either of two bills scheduled for a legislative hearing Wednesday. "This happens every day to people," said Sen. Megan Hunt, who introduced one of the bills. "It happens to high schoolers. It happens to college kids. I think you'd be hard-pressed to find anybody under 30 who doesn't know somebody who has been affected by this." The bill from Hunt, of Omaha, would bar people from transmitting or posting sexual photographs online without the permission of the person who's depicted. First-time violators could face a misdemeanor charge, while repeat offenders could be charged with a felony. Perpetrators also would have to register as a sex offender if they were 19 or older at the time and the victim was younger than 18 years old.

The McCook Community College baseball team dropped a pair of games Sunday at Lamar to finish the weekend series 1-3. On Sunday it was all Lamar winning the first game 6-2 and taking the series finale 8-1. On Saturday the Indians won the first game 4-1 on a masterful pitching performance from freshman Isaac Vargas, (Greeley, Colo.), but in the second game Lamar came up with an 8-0 win. MCC was held to 11 hits and three runs in the three losses. Lamar goes to 8-9 on the year and 6-3 in Empire League play. The Indians are 5-8 on the season and 3-5 in Empire League play. Six games are on tap this week for MCC including a home-opener postponed several times this season by weather. Garden City is scheduled to play at the Jaycees Sports Complex for a 3 p.m. game Tuesday. MCC travels to Norfolk Wednesday for a doubleheader against Northeast Community College. This weekend MCC travels to new Empire League foe Southeast Community College for a single nine-inning game Saturday at Beatrice and a Sunday doubleheader.

It was a memorable Senior Day for the Nebraska men's basketball team on Sunday, as the Huskers erased a 16-point second-half deficit and scored 16 points in the final 47 seconds of regulation to force overtime in an eventual 93-91 victory over Iowa in front of 15,821 fans at Pinnacle Bank Arena. Seniors James Palmer Jr. and Glynn Watson Jr. combined for 15 points in the final minute of regulation, helping Nebraska erase a nine-point deficit. NU trailed 74-65 with 50 seconds remaining, but Palmer and Watson hit four 3-pointers over the next 38 seconds, with a Watson three bringing Nebraska to within 80-79 with 23 seconds left. After Iowa connected on 1-of-2 free throws, Palmer tied the game with a driving layup with 12 seconds remaining, and Nebraska withstood an Iowa 3-point attempt in the closing seconds. The Huskers will take on Rutgers in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament this Wednesday.

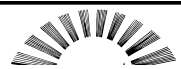
