A HEARING IS SCHEDULED FRIDAY OCTOBER 24TH

Nebraska will be paid a base rate of roughly \$2.5 million a month to run the McCook Work Ethic Camp as a detention center for U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. That and other details are contained in the contract between Nebraska and the Department of Homeland Security, which the state made public on Friday. In the first year of the contract, which began Sept. 30, Nebraska will be paid about \$2.46 million per month, or about \$269 per detainee. In the second year, the monthly rate goes up to \$2.53 million, or roughly \$277 per detainee. Contract language indicates that both men and women could be held at the facility. Sen. Megan Hunt, who's been critical of the state using the facility for ICE detention, said she sees a number of problems with the contract, which she called "morally wrong." "I mean, I could go line by line and give you like 20 different ones, but some of the ones that worry me the most is that this ICE contract bans videotaping, recording and even public access to a state-owned facility," Hunt said. "And that is unacceptable." Hunt also criticized the lack of information that's been made available about the facility and the deal between the state and the federal government. On Thursday, more than a dozen McCook residents and a former Nebraska state senator filed a lawsuit seeking an injunction to stop the Work Ethic Camp from being used as an ICE detention facility. A hearing on that lawsuit is scheduled for Oct. 24 at 9 a.m. in McCook.

HUNTING SEASONS CONTINUING TO OPEN

With the crop harvest ongoing and hunting seasons continuing to open, the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission reminds hunters to be courteous. Hunters should expect to encounter farm vehicles and equipment on country roads and make room for them when they do so. Large equipment can need extra room on the road, so hunters, whether hunting on private land or public land, should park in provided lots and not along public roadways. As a reminder, no person may hunt on private land without the explicit permission of the landowner. A hunter of private land should follow the landowner's rules, treat the property with respect and follow all hunting regulations.

The McCook Bison boys tennis team will compete in the first day of the Class B state tennis tournament today at Woods 🖥 Park in Lincoln. The Bison volleyball team heads to Cozad for the first day of the Southwest Conference Volleyball Tournament. The MHS girls will face Gothenburg at 4 p.m. The MHS/ Gothenburg winner will face top-seed Ogallala in the next round. The RPAC Conference Tournament resumes tonight in Benkelman and Bartley. RPAC West matches start at 4 p.m. and can be heard on 103.9 The Hawk. RPAC East matches also start at 4 p.m. and will air on KICX 961 and the KICX 961 YouTube channel. The championship and consolation matches will be at the Graff Events Center tomorrow night.

The No. 1 Nebraska volleyball team swept its ninth match in a row, 25-18, 25-13, 25-18 at Michigan on Sunday afternoon. Nebraska (18-0, 8-0 Big Ten) has won 28 sets in a row, its longest streak since winning 30 sets in a row in 2010. The Huskers are a perfect 24-0 in Big Ten sets this season. Michigan fell to 12-7 (2-6 Big Ten). The match was played in front of a crowd of 12,707 — the first ever sold-out volleyball match at the Crisler Center. It shattered Michigan's previous attendance school record of 8,137 in 2017 against Ohio State. It also marks the 19th different arena attendance record Nebraska has been part of since Volleyball Day in Nebraska in 2023. The Huskers hit .390 and held the Wolverines to .079. The Big Red has hit better than .300 in nine straight matches.
