COURT ORDER OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY IN CARROLL COUNTY

WHEREAS, On December 31, 2019 novel coronavirus, now designated COVID-19, was detected in Wuhan, China; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared COVID-19 a global pandemic and the Center for Disease Control (CDC) has reported that there have been an escalating number of cases and deaths from COVID-19 in the United States and the State of Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the CDC is closely monitoring the growing number of COVID-19 cases that have spread into the United States; and

WHEREAS, the continued spread of COVID-19 constitutes a natural calamity and presents an imminent threat of widespread illness, which requires emergency action; and

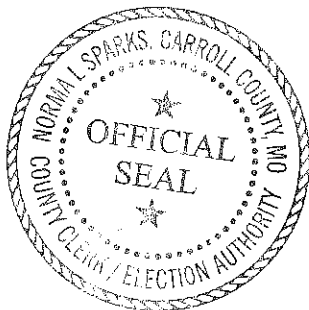
WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States issued a State of Emergency for the country in response to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the Governor of Missouri signs executive order 20-02, declaring a State of Emergency in response to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, the court order of the State of Emergency provides Carroll County the ability to take measures to reduce the possibility of exposure to disease, control the risk, and promote the health and safety of Carroll County, Missouri, and an emergency exists; and

NOW THEREFORE, I, Stan Falke, Presiding Commissioner and Emergency Management Director of Carroll County, hereby declare that a State of Emergency exists in Carroll County, Missouri, and hereby declare in full force and effect in Carroll County, Missouri, all laws, statutes, of the State of Missouri, Carroll County, for the exercise of all necessary emergency authority for the protection of the lives and property of the people of Carroll County, Missouri.

Carroll County Officials Issue Executive Order
Regarding CORONAVIRUS
(Covid-19)

Carroll County Health Center, Presiding Commissioner Stan Falke, Mayor Scott Bartlett have issued an Executive Order regarding the COVID-19 pandemic, Effective Monday, March 23rd-2020 at Midnight.

The order prohibits group gatherings of 10 people or more until further notice. This includes any restaurant, tavern, professional, social, cultural, entertainment or other special event or community gathering where people are not separated by physical space of at least six feet.

Restaurants, bars and taverns are to close until further notice, except for delivery, pickup and drive-through services. No more than 10 people in a convenience store at any one time including employees, vendors and customers.

Entertainment and recreational facilities should not allow the general public or facility members to enter. Those facilities include, but are not limited to, theaters, private clubs, fitness centers and bowling alleys.

Hotels that serve breakfast are to serve packaged food and patrons are to take it back to their rooms. Childcare facilities should follow the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services Guidance.

Schools are to be closed with the support of superintendents from Carroll County until April 6th 2020 when the situation will be reassessed with guidance from the Health Center. School operations include any institution of elementary and secondary education, including but not limited to, public, chartered, private, or parochial institutions.

The temporary prohibitions of group gathering does not apply to day-to-day operations of organizations such as healthcare, and long term care facilities, grocery stores, pharmacies, gas stations, or business or industries with limited to no in-person contact with the public.

Guidelines to minimize the risk of spreading the COVID-19 for gatherings with fewer than 10 people include older adults and those with underlying health conditions, including employees being encouraged to not attend gatherings, limiting contact of people within six feet from each other for 10 minutes or longer, proper hand hygiene and sanitation being readily available to employees, and clean and disinfect high touch surfaces daily or more frequently.
